Faith In God

COCCESSON .

Mark 11 v 22: "Then Jesus said to the disciples, "Have faith in God".

Galatians 3 v 7 (NLT): "The real children of Abraham, then, are those who put their faith in God"

2 Corinthians 5 v 7 (20th Century): "For we guide our lives by faith and not by what we see".

Week 1 You Must Be Born Again

COCCESSORY.

"....Rabbi," he said, "we all know that God has sent you to teach us. Your miraculous signs are evidence that God is with you". Jesus replied, "I tell you the truth, unless you are born again, you cannot see the kingdom of God". (John 3 v 2 - 3)

Nicodemus hears and witnesses the supernatural life Jesus is living, the miracles, the authority, the fact demons and sickness listen to His words. Nicodemus desires that kind of life, so he engages in a conversation with Jesus asking Him what is His secret?

Jesus tells him: "You must be born again" (John 2 v 7). Jesus was explaining the reason His life was supernatural, it was because His birth was supernatural. He was telling

Nicodemus: "...if you want a supernatural life, you must also have a supernatural birth."

Salvation isn't getting a ticket to heaven for when you die, salvation is entrance into God's kingdom when you live. Salvation is God giving you new birth that qualifies you for a supernatural life. Your supernatural birth opens the door for your supernatural life.

Jesus did not model to us what God can do on earth, Jesus modelled for us what a man submitted to the Holy Spirit can do on the earth. When you get born again by the Spirit, your relationship with Him begins.

After Adam's sin in the garden of Eden death spread to all and dominated the family. Before you got born again and became a new creature in Christ (2 Corinthians 5 v 17), you were dead spiritually and destined for eternal death.

After the fall, mankind was in need of healing and a Saviour. Man kind needed a doctor with answers, someone who could diagnose the problem and provide the correct prescription. God our Great Physician has never misdiagnosed anyone who has come to Him.


Mankind's problem was terminal and God knew it. His prescription was: crucifixion, death and burial. Romans 6 v 4 says: "we are buried with Him by baptism into death, that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life".

The good news is Jesus provides a death whereby you can die and be raised from the dead and have a change of identity!

Ephesians 2 v 1 "you He made alive who were dead in trespasses and sins". It took Jesus three days, but it can happen for you in three seconds, as you cry out and call upon His Name to save you. Romans 10 v 13 says "whoever calls on the name of the Lord Jesus shall be saved".

Pray: "God I invite Your Son Jesus Christ in to my heart today. Save me and forgive me from my sins. I believe in my heart and confess with my mouth that Jesus is the Son of God sent by the Father God to redeem me. I receive Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour. I am now born again, I am now a new creature in Christ. Amen".

Week 2 Ever Increasing Faith



"We are bound to thank God always for you, brethren, as it is fitting, because your faith grows exceedingly, and the love of every one of you all abounds toward each other".

(2 Thessalonians 1 v 3)

Before you trust you have to listen. Unless Christ's Word is preached there is nothing to listen to (Romans 10 v 17). Faith is birthed in a heart that responds to God's anointed Word. Speaking is powerful and very necessary, but you don't talk yourself into faith, you hear yourself into faith, then and only then can you release faith-filled words that produce.

Spend time this week listening to everything God wants to teach you. Fill your thoughts with God's words until they penetrate deep into your spirit and you will go from one level

- of faith to another and grow exceedingly (2 Thessalonians 1 v 3). Your faith life begins with natural faith, but it can grow exceedingly to the God kind of faith.
- 1. Human Natural Faith: is something we all have. There is nothing supernatural about it, it is a faith that believes it can walk across the street without being hit by a car and killed.
- 2. The Measure of Faith: has been assigned (dealt) to every believer. Romans 12 v 3: "...God has dealt to each one a measure of faith".

All come into the family of God with a measure of faith. You don't come into the body of Christ on empty faith. When the gospel was preached to you, there was an injection of faith in your heart when you first heard. The injected faith gave you the ability to receive the message. The 'measure of faith' was dealt to each man. You didn't have to work for it, you didn't take responsibility to get it, it is something God gave you.

- 3. The God Kind of Faith: Jesus told His disciples "Have faith in God" (Mark 11 v 22), in other words "have the God-kind of faith". This kind of faith comes and grows by hearing God's anointed Word and you have also been dealt the responsibility to grow it by the Word.
- 4. The Gift of Faith: Paul outlined as one of the manifestations of the Holy Spirit in 1 Corinthians 12 v 9: "to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit".

The 'gift of faith' is a divine supernatural manifestation of God that operates as the Spirit of God wills, at a specific time, at a specific place, for a specific purpose. When the 'gift of faith' is in manifestation you can believe God to do exceedingly over and above what your current level of faith could believe God to do. The 'gift of faith' enables you to fulfil your assignment and go beyond your own ability!

Your assignment will take you places that will require you to develop the 'measure of faith' dealt to you. Have the 'God kind of faith' and get ready to operate boldly in the 'gift of faith' and supernatural things will happen.

Week 3 A Faith Found Praising

"...the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perishes, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ".

(1 Peter 1 v 7)

We walk by spiritual unseen realities that are described in the Word of God. Galatians 3 v 11 declares: "The just shall live by faith", not "the just lives by sight".

A life lived in faith isn't a life void of doubts, it is a life confronting them. A life lived in faith isn't a life void of pain, it is the confronting of that pain. In the middle of confronting doubts, pains, hurt, there is a belief in God that remains unshaken and pure. The way our faith gets that way is; it is tried by fire.

Peter talked about seasons of manifold temptations and trials. Paul the apostle experienced seasons filled with many trials that tested his faith. In Acts 28, the apostle Paul ends up on an island called Malta, a place that wasn't even on God's radar! In fact, God was dealing with Paul and the crew of the ship not to sail, however they violated their heart at the expense of their head and it almost cost them their life.

Paul ended up on Malta, none of which was God's will, God planned for Paul to be in Rome not Malta! But Paul found himself in a storm, experiencing manifold trials, all because of the disobedience of others. Paul was found praying and pleading to our heavenly Father. Tests come because there is a thief, a killer and destroyer who hates us, called satan.

Paul had people who planned to kill him. Acts 23 v 12, tells us forty men banded together and bound themselves under an oath not to eat or drink until they had killed Paul. But the following night the Lord stood by Paul and told him "Be of good cheer, Paul, for as you have testified for Me in Jerusalem, so you must also bear witness at Rome" (Acts 23 v 11).

The reason Paul was instructed by the Lord to be of good cheer and praise God is praise ushers in the anointing and the anointing destroys the yoke (Isaiah 10 v 27). Live in heaven's best blessings by praising and worshipping God long enough until fresh anointing comes in and breaks the yoke.

I heard a friend say "sometimes good times mask good habits". In seasons of challenge people wake up to truths that they have

been ignoring. They see the need to come back to church and pray again. Those Godly habits were always there and always needful, but what the trial did was wake them up to the truths and principles they had been ignoring.

Death is not the end, it is simply a departure and when we depart this earth, we will stand before Jesus who has eyes of love and who sits on the throne of grace. Not only will we see Him face to face, He will see us and will examine our faith.

I pray when Jesus returns your faith is found praising God, in the good times and in the challenging seasons of life. "Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us" (Romans 8 v 37).

Faith In The Name

Lectory.

Acts 3 v 16: "And His Name, through faith in His name, has made this man strong, whom you see and know. Yes, the faith which comes through Him has given him this perfect soundness in the presence of you all".

John 14 v 13 - 14: "And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it".

Week 4 Pray In The Name of Jesus



"And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it". (1 John 14 v 13 - 14)

Jesus' disciples are extremely upset when He begins to tell them that He must leave them (John 14, 15, 16), but Jesus begins to explain "I'm giving you something that is going to be even better then Me being here with you...".

He begins to tell them about the Holy Spirit, "....Father shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you for ever" (John 14 v 16). Jesus begins to explain how the Holy Spirit is just like Him, He is "another Comforter". Jesus is basically telling them, "everything that I have been to you, the Holy Spirit will be exactly that and then some".

Jesus continues telling them what to expect, "He (Holy Spirit) will be with you forever to help, guide, reveal God's will and bring to remembrance all that is needed. The Holy Spirit will show you things to come and empower you for life and effective ministry..." (John 14 v 26, John 16 v 7, John 16 v 13).

The difference between Jesus and the Holy Spirit for the disciples was, if Jesus was in Capernaum then they would have to be in Capernaum to be with Him. But where ever the disciples go, there the Holy Spirit will be forever!

Jesus then explains: "....not only am I going to give you another Comforter, but I am going to give you something that is going to be just like Me being there with you". Notice what Jesus tells them: "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father". (John 14 v 12).

At this point, Jesus' disciples are thinking "...how in the world are we going to do what You did Jesus...never mind the greater works". Notice what Jesus tells them in response: "And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it" (John 14 v 13-14).

In other words "you want to know how you'll do the greater works? Whatever you ask, just ask in My Name and I (Jesus) will do it".

Jesus is telling them "Whatever you ask in My Name I will take full responsibility for. My Name will be exactly what I would be if I was there and My Name will do exactly what I would do if I was there doing it!". Whenever you ask in the Name of Jesus, you are assigning full responsibility to Jesus to make it happen.

Jesus knew His disciples would struggle to get their heads around what He had just told them, so He tells them again in John 16 v 23 - 24: "....whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you. Until now you have asked nothing in My name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full".

Do you know what happened this time? The disciples believed so strong that they actually starting asking in the Name of Jesus. Do you know what I pray? I pray you too will believe.

Acts 3 records the first miracle account using the Name of Jesus. We see the Name of Jesus doing exactly what Jesus would have done had He been there.

Jesus not long before this account, told them "Anything you ask the Father in My Name, I will do it". They believed 'the Name of Jesus' would do exactly what Jesus would do if Jesus was there!

Acts 3 v 16: "And His Name, through faith in His name, has made this man strong, whom you see and know. Yes, the faith which comes through Him has given him this perfect soundness in the presence of you all".

Week 5 Confront Fear With The Name of The Lord

"....I come to you in the Name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied....". (1 Samuel 17 v 45)

The Name of the Lord was David's armour when he stood before Goliath! David confronted Goliath because he was more focused on his covenant than the giant he had to confront. David understood the covenant names of God, he knew Goliath must bow at the Name of the Lord!

Philippians 2 v 9 - 10: "Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth".

God's names in the Bible reveal His nature and God's nature defines His actions, that is why God has so many compound names in the Bible. He isn't just Jehovah Jireh 'God will provide', He is Jehovah Shalom the Lord is peace, He is Jehovah Nissi 'The Lord is my victory banner'.

Goliath lifted up his spear and sword, but David lifted up his voice and his victory banner (the Name of the Lord). I believe the key to David's focus on the Lord when death seemed inevitable was his devotion. David's delight was the Word of God, that he meditated day and night (Psalm 1 v 2).

If you know how to worry you know how to meditate. Unless your mind is renewed, the giant and the mountain will always be too big. The voice you believe will determine the future you experience.

Without Goliath using any of his weapons, the whole Israeli army was emotionally and mentally put out of action. If you keep on listening to the giant's fear filled words, their words will silence and immobilise you.

I read a commentary that Goliath's armour weighed over 700 lbs and was over 9 feet tall. Yet it wasn't Goliath's size or weaponry that caused Saul and the men of Israel to shrink back in fear, it was the constant threats and mental bombardments from Goliath.

Saul's focus wasn't his covenant with God, it wasn't on the Name of the Lord. Saul's meditation was the threats Goliath gave, whereas David's meditation was His covenant, he was covenant minded and it was David's focus that separated him from Saul and the men of war.

Confront fear by going to some One bigger than the fear, God Himself. That is exactly what David did, he spoke to Goliath saying "...." you come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin. But I come to you in the Name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. This is the day the Lord will deliver you into my hand..." 1 Samuel 17 v 45.

Live free from stress, it isn't your divine design. Confront fear with your faith in the Name of the Lord!

Week 6 Praise His Wonderful Name



"....His name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace....".

(Isaiah 9 v 6)

Prophet Isaiah said we will call His Name 'Wonderful', in other words His Name is full of wonder. As you lift up the wonderful Name of Jesus in praise, you release the wonder in His Name. Get ready for signs, wonders and miracles as you continue to give God praise.

Ephesians 5 v 4 (New English Bible) says: "Let there be no coarse, stupid or flippant talk; these things are out of place; you should rather be thanking God". It isn't possible to speak harsh and thank God at the same time.

Instead of using your words to tear people down, train your mouth to shout for joy instead of shouting at others. Train your mouth to lift God's praises.

Smith Wigglesworth said: "The strength of a man's life is the strength of his song. When the pressure is heavy that is the time to sing. It takes a man to sing in the dark when the storm and battles are raging, and it is such singing that makes the man".

As you begin to think about how good God is, those harsh and angry words will just slip away unspoken. Declare: "I will not be the casualty of my own mind".

Praise ripens the fruits of the spirit, because praise waters the seeds sown and God will never allow a praiser to lose, because praise puts a stop to loss.

Psalm 5 v 11 - 12: "But let them all be glad, those who turn aside to hide themselves in you. May they keep shouting for joy forever! Overshadow them in your presence as they sing and rejoice. Then every lover of Your name will burst with endless joy. Lord, how wonderfully you bless the righteous. Your favour wraps around each one and covers them under your canopy of kindness and joy".

Thanksgiving not only pays the debt for the things God has done, but it increases your capacity for the things He will do in your life. Praise releases heaven's forces to move on your behalf with intensity no demonic foe can withstand.

Praise The Wonderful Name of The Lord!

Faith In The Blood

Romans 3 v 25: "Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God".

Week 7 Faith In The Blood



"Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus,". (Hebrews 10 v 19)

The blood of Jesus has granted you access in to God's presence and the moment you access His presence, you also give God access to every single part of your life and any situation you need His help.

You are not trying to get healing, you have literally accessed 'The Healer'. You are not trying to get the provision needed, you have accessed 'The Provider'. Exercise your 'right of access' and draw closer and closer to the Father with your child-like faith.

Nobody has greater access to God the Father than you, you don't need to ask someone to put in a good word for you. You have been brought near to Himself by the blood, therefore enter His presence boldly. You are God's blood bought, blood washed and blood blessed child.

The blood of Jesus gives you unshakable assurance that God is eager to receive you. The blood of Jesus not only silences the devil but also silences the voice of self-condemnation too. Be quick to repent, quick to forgive and quick to believe in the power of the blood.

It is through faith in His blood, we are righteous (Romans 3 v 25). Many have left the blood out of their faith confessions. But if you are going to have ever increasing faith in the blood of Jesus, you need to have a bold confession of faith in what the blood of Jesus has done for you.

Your faith must be in the realities of what Jesus' blood in heaven has purchased and what His blood does on the inside of you. Refuse feelings of guilt because of the past, refuse any sense of unworthiness, don't let it rob you of the power of Jesus' blood!

You are not under the dark shadow of sin, you are under God's grace, you have been washed in the blood of Jesus. Psalm 32 v 1: "Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven...".

Week 8 Out of The Shadow

COCCASSON.

"There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death". (Romans 8 v 1 - 2)

Through the substitutional work of Jesus, He became sin so that you could become righteous. You have been justified. As the justified, you can say: "In Christ I live just as if I have never sinned, for Jesus came to take away sin".

Sin has no power to hold you back anymore, the power of sin has been done away with, as long as you don't yield to it and obey its lure. Paul told the Romans "do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death or of obedience leading to righteousness?" (Romans 6 v 16).

Just like 'fear' must be yielded to for it to come in, it is the same for sin!

Jesus said "do not let your heart be troubled. You believe in God" (John 14 v 1). In other words, if your heart is afraid it is because you let it be afraid.

Sin is present, but you have got to decide not to let it in, you have got to submit to God and resist sin and it will flee (James $4 \ v \ 7$).

If you have yielded to temptation and sinned, don't go back under sin's shadow, not even for three seconds. Be quick to repent and quick to believe in Jesus' blood that has washed you clean, then be quick to laugh at the devil!

If the accuser brings up a picture of your past, say: "ha hadevil, ha ha! That doesn't exist anymore, that simply does not exist". What if the accuser persists? The more he persists, the more you laugh.

God gave us His Word, "If we confess our sin before Him, He would forgive us of all unrighteousness and cleanse us completely" (1 John 1 v 9). It isn't good form to bring up the memories of your past mistakes, so forget about it.

One of the best ways you resist the devil is by laughing at his accusations, remind the accuser he has no legal right to condemn you for you are in Christ! Romans 8 v 1: "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus...".

Week 9 Blood Washed Not Sin Stained!



"having wiped out the handwriting of requirements that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross". (Colossians 2 v 14)

Remind yourself of the awesome price Jesus paid at Calvary. At Calvary Jesus proved how much He is for you and how much He is against sin, so much so He gave His life as the sacrifice for all.

Faith is largely dependent on knowledge, if your knowledge of the blood of Jesus is not accurate, then your faith will expect little and the more powerful effects of the blood will be limited. Like one minister put it: "Feeble ideas of the blood's power will prevent the deeper and more perfect manifestations of its effects".

If the devil can keep you ignorant he can trick you into defeat. But once you know the Truth liberty follows. Jesus said: "The Truth you know will set you free" John 8 v 32.

Most of the time, your problems are not demonic, but Adamic (meaning, the human nature that originates from first man Adam). But when you get a revelation of what Jesus did on the cross, you will realise your original conditions have pass away, and they have been replaced by new conditions in Christ!

Hebrews 10 v 17: "...their sins and iniquities will I remember no more". Jesus' blood is still flowing and washing, the cross is still saving and the Name of Jesus is still delivering lives.

Under the Levitical law, an animal had to be offered every year to atone (to cover) for the sins of the people. But Jesus offered Himself once and for all, His blood did not cover us, His blood completely removed the stain and put your sin in remission.

The word remission means 'the cancellation of, to make it of none effect'. Jesus erased our sin! He nailed it to the cross so that you would no longer have to suffer the shame of your past (Colossians 2 v 14).

The blood of Jesus is retroactive, His blood reaches into your past, then reaches into your future and secures God's perfect plan for your life. You are not sin stained, you are a blood washed saint!

REFLECTION

James 1 v 25: "...he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does".

Faith In The Power of God

Lesson -

1 Corinthians 2 v 5: "That your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God".

Isaiah 10 v 27: "It shall come to pass in that day, That his burden will be taken away from your shoulder, And his yoke from your neck, And the yoke will be destroyed because of the anointing oil".

Week 10 Power of God In The Gospel



"That your faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God". (1 Corinthians 2 v 5)

The Word of God not only is full of power, it is the power of God (Romans 1 v 16) and when you declare the Word, tremendous overcoming power is released.

Everywhere Jesus went He preached the Kingdom of God, Paul the apostle who wrote to the Romans was also a powerful preacher and shared powerful truths, but neither Jesus or Paul are here, but the Message is and God's Spirit is. People say "I need more power", but what they really need is more gospel, because all the power you need is in the gospel. Acts 10 v 44: (NLT) "Even as Peter was saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the message". The

power in the gospel falls where it is preached and where it is believed. Someone may say: "well I've been in a lot of meetings, heard a lot of messages preached but experienced no power...". Maybe it wasn't the Word you heard or perhaps it was the Word of God but you didn't believe. Where the Word of God is heard and believed, God's power is revealed.

Judges 15 v 16: "Then Samson said: "With the jawbone of a donkey, Heaps upon heaps, With the jawbone of a donkey I have slain a thousand men!".

Samson in the Old Testament is a type of the church of Jesus Christ, who defeated the enemy with the jawbone of a donkey. The way you enforce your victory and overcome the enemy is with your mouth. The primary outworking of your faith is your words. When people don't walk in their authority, there is an absence of speaking God's Word and as a result an absence of power.

You are not a mindless puppet in God's hand, you have authority. Mountains in your life will remain unmoved until they are spoken to, by you.

Samson tore off the gates of the city, and Jesus said "And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it" Matthew 16 v 18. Satan is trying to strangle hold the church, but hell shall not prevail against the church.

Samson forsook the secret of his power, but later Samson returned to God and accomplished double in the end of his life. The sad reality in the body of Christ is, many have abandoned the power of God's Word and the gifts of the Spirit, but they are returning to the Word and embracing the move of the Spirit.

The devil is just as afraid of the message of what happened as he is about what actually happened, because the Word of God not only contains power, it is God's power! What an honour it is for your lips of clay to declare eternal messages of power.

Week 11 Because of The Anointing

COCCESSOR S

"It shall come to pass in that day, That his burden will be taken away from your shoulder, And his yoke from your neck, And the yoke will be destroyed because of the anointing oil".

(Isaiah 10 v 27)

Typically a very heavy beam called an 'yoke' was used to control an oxen, it was used to control and enable the animal topull a heavy load (burden). The oxen would pull a wagon or farming equipment, which would greatly hinder the forward progress of the animal.

God used Isaiah to illustrate what the anointing does (Isaiah 10 v 27). First of all it disconnects and removes the heavy burden from your life that have hindered your forward progress, and then God's power goes to work to remove the

yoke of bondage used by the devil to steer you in the wrong direction. Not only does the anointing remove the burden and yoke, the anointing destroys it once it has been removed off of you. The power of God doesn't just break the yoke and burden, it utterly destroys it so that it can't be pieced back together and put back on you.

In Luke 8 v 43 - 48, when the women with the issue of blood touched Jesus' garment power surged out of Him and went into her. When the anointing was released into her body, the issue of blood she carried in her body (which every doctor she sought to cure couldn't treat or fix) was cured and totally healed.

Just one touch of the anointing of God lifted that burden off of her and she was completely and utterly delivered. Jesus' life went to working in her life. What was once one way, was transformed into something else, all because of the anointing.

When Paul preached the gospel in Lystra (Acts 14 v 8 - 10) there was a certain man who according to Acts 14 v 9"...heard Paul speaking..." received faith to be healed. One translation of Romans 10 v 17 says "faith comes by hearing the Word of Christ, the anointed Word of God".

It says in Acts 14 v 9 - 10: "...Paul, observing him intently and seeing that he had faith to be healed, said with a loud voice, "Stand up straight on your feet!" And he leaped and walked". Think about it, Paul preached the Word (which includes healing) in such a way that the man who was born crippled, the man who had

never walked before received faith to walk as God intended him to walk.

The anointing can remove the hardest of mindsets! Usually the longer somebody goes through something, the harder it is for them to see themselves without that particular issue, whether it is an emotional, physical or financial situation.

For someone to see themselves healed, when all they have known is sickness, is only possible when receiving the anointing of God after hearing the anointed Word of God.

In Lystra Paul preached the gospel so full of the anointing that it removed and broke up every negative mind-set that the crippled man carried throughout his life.

Week 12 Jump When Prompted

COCCESSOD .

"I say to you, if you have faith as a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there', and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you". (Matthew 17 v 20)

Paith is about pleasing God (Hebrews 11 v 6), not just obtaining and receiving things for yourself. Faith is hearing God tell you to step out and being obedient to His Voice to step out. When you heed the prompting of God's Spirit and step out in obedience, even when there is nothing supporting you but what God has said, you are well pleasing to God.

Matthew 17 v 20 (AMP) "He answered, "Because of your little faith [your lack of trust and confidence in the power of God]; for I assure you and most solemnly say to you, if you have [living] faith

the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, "Move from here to there", and [if it is God's will] it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you".

Jesus told them, if you have living, active, alive faith, you would say! Your words released in faith make a draw on the power of God.

Baby locusts have the ability and power in their legs to jump two hundred times their height, at that height they will fly for only two to five seconds. They have learnt to wait for the perfect conditions, the perfect wind that is blowing at a speed of two miles per hour, and once they get their wings out and catch the wind these little guys can fly for miles!

It isn't that they have the strength within and of themselves to do it, they just timed their jump perfectly. With a little bit of effort they jump up into the wind and it is the wind that takes them much further than they could ever go in their own strength.

You may be thinking "...but I have only got baby locust, mustard seed size faith...", but if you would start using the little you think you have and be sensitive to God's perfect timing you will go far! Jump when God says to jump and you will catch the move of the Spirit, which will take you miles further than you could ever go yourself.

Locusts time their jump perfectly, stay tuned to the Spirit of God, only move when you sense the breeze of the Spirit. There

is a window of opportunity to step out in faith! Your 'wings' may not be big enough to go the distance, perhaps you feel like you can only flap for two to five seconds, but you are not alone! God is with you and His Spirit will carry you as you jump when prompted by Him.

"...Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit", says the LORD of hosts" (Zechariah 4 v 6).

Faith In The Word of God

Hebrews 4 v 2: "For indeed the gospel was preached to us as well as to them; but the word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in those who heard it".

Proverbs 4 v 20 - 21: "My son, attend to My words; incline thine ear unto My sayings. Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart".

Week 13 Given Words

"For I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me".

(John 17 v 8)

If you want to hear Jesus pray, go ahead and read John chapter 17. The entire chapter reveals what Jesus prayed, it gives us a glimpse into Jesus' prayer life. Notice what He prayed in John 17 v 7: "Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You". V8: "For I have given to them the words which You have given Me...".

The words God gave Jesus enabled Him to function and do what He did. Jesus acknowledged and gave credit to the

Words the Father gave Him, which enabled Him to fulfil the ministry He was commissioned to fulfil.

Jesus didn't just hold on to the Words God gave Him, He said: "...I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them...". He could have given you anything, but He knew the best thing He could have given you is heavenly God authored Words.

Words from God are containers full of power needed for life! Words from heaven, are the greatest gift heaven could give. In John 17 v 8, Jesus goes on to declare: "....and they have received them....".

It isn't enough for God's Word to be spoken to you, you have to receive those Words in order for them to bring benefit in your life. All the healings and deliverances that were worked through Jesus' ministry, were done with words. The multiplication of supplies, the healing of bodies, the raising of the dead, all were done with the Words God gave Jesus.

The Roman centurion asked Jesus for one thing, he asked Him for His Words and Jesus gave them to him, resulting in the Roman centurion's servant being raised up. Jesus let the Roman Centurion determine how he wanted to receive help. He told Jesus: "You don't need to come to my house, Your words are enough for me" (paraphrase Matthew 8 v 8).

If a member of your family was in a life or death situation and Jesus was ready and willing to come and personally minister healing to them, would you have enough faith in God's spoken Word to say: "Jesus you don't need to show up to my house, just give me Your Words"? It is a good challenging question.

Jesus gave you His Words, but His Words alone are not enough. You must receive them, believe them and know God's power within the Word is released and activated when spoken.

Hebrews 4 v 2: "For indeed the gospel was preached to us as well as to them; but the word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in those who heard it".

Week 14 Spirit of Faith

"...since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "I believed and therefore I spoke," we also believe and therefore speak". (2 Corinthians 4 v 13)

Consider where you came from, Isaiah 51 v 1 (NLT): "...concede the rock from which you were cut, the quarry from which you were mined" v2: "Yes, think about Abraham, your ancestor, and Sarah, who gave birth to your nation. Abraham was only one man when I called him. But when I blessed him, he became a great nation".

You have the same spirit of faith that framed the world that we see, the same spirit of faith that was on David, the same spirit of faith that was on Abraham is on you. The disease that is hurting many lives, ministries, businesses is faithlessness

and displaced faith. We are not to have faith in our faith, our faith is in our God! Galatians 3 v 7 (NLT): "The real children of Abraham, then, are those who put their faith in God".

Faith is the currency of the Spirit used to receive the blessings and promises of God. Faith is an extremely powerful force, it is a supernatural substance. Faith allows us to make supernatural transactions with heaven! Faith is the bridge between heaven and earth. Faith is God's element that He has delivered to us so that we can interact with Him.

In light of all of that, it would make total sense for the devil to do everything in his power to keep us from hearing the Word of God! Since faith comes by hearing God's Word, satan will continually try to keep you from gaining the Word, he wants to prevent your faith from growing. Satan works over time trying to stifle faith by throwing road blocks to discourage, and keep you from working with the faith you have already received. The devil doesn't really care if you have faith, as long as you are not working your faith properly.

The faith you carry, needs the Word of God invested into your heart in order to produce substance. Faith must have a foundation to it's belief. If you haven't received a Word from God, your faith is baseless. Smith Wigglesworth said: "This Book (the Bible) is my heavenly bank. I find everything I need in it".

Daily feed your faith with God's Word, it is faith's food. Psalm 1 v 2 (AMPC) "But his delight and desire are in the law of the Lord,

and on His law (the precepts, the instructions, the teachings of God) he habitually meditates (ponders and studies) by day and by night".

Declare it: "I was (past tense) weak and defeated in sin, but when I joined up with the Lion of the tribe of Judah, I became mighty in God. Jesus is my brother, God is my Father and satan is no relation at all. According to Proverbs 28 v 1, I am bold as a lion because the brother of a lion is a lion! I am in the household of faith and operate in the same spirit of faith that Jesus operated in! God's power is on the inside of me to win every battle of life".

*Week 15*Eyes on The Word

"My son, attend to My words; incline thine ear unto My sayings. Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart". (Proverbs 4 v 20 - 21)

Yield your self to spiritual things and you will have natural evidence of something supernatural in your life".

It is high time to give your attention on the things that matter! Kenneth. E. Hagin said: "The man or women that will lend his or her tongue to God, by praying in the spirit will quickly learn to master every other part of their life".

Yield your heart, lend your tongue and keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it springs the issues of life (Proverbs 4 v 23).

Faith is of the heart, so guard and protect it! If you protect your faith, your faith will protect you. I really like the picture Paul the Apostle paints of faith as a protecting shield! Paul said: "above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one" Ephesians 6 v 16.

God goes where your faith puts Him, God's power will always meet your faith. This is why the devil attacks your faith by trying to get your focus, he wants you responding emotionally to circumstances of life, to get you out of the flow of faith. Your life doesn't need your emotional reaction, your life needs your spiritual faith response.

In Matthew 14, Peter jumped out of the boat in response to Jesus' word "come". Did Peter walk on water or did Peter walk on the Word Jesus gave him? Peter walked on one word from Jesus and walked right across the storm without a problem (Matthew 14 v 30-31).

When you step out on God's Word, you too will experience His mighty up lifting power! One word from God radically changes lives! Smith Wigglesworth said: "God's Word is, supernatural in origin, eternal in duration, inexpressible in valour, infinite in scope, regenerative in power, infallible in authority, universal in application, inspired in totality!".

One word received from God and Peter walked right over the storm. Peter fastened his whole being on to the Word Jesus spoke "Come!". However, when Peter took his attention off Jesus and off the Word, he began to give his attention to the storm resulting in his faith slipping out of gear and he began to sink.

Once you get a revelation from the Word of God, hold on to it, don't allow your focus to slip. The key to conquering is locking down on a bold courageous spirit, that comes and is imparted to you from God's Word.

The devil will continue to use 'weapons of mass distractions' to get you to turn loose of your hold on God's Word. The enemy will try and cause you to react to the storms that rage around you, do not fall in to his trap!

The devil wants you to get back into your old way of stinking sinking thinking, because he wants to get you out of faith and into fear. The enemy knows faith is the victory Christians have that overcomes the world (1 John 5 v 4), so he attacks it with distractions.

Paul didn't say "...without faith it is improbable to please God..", he said: "without faith it is impossible to please God.." (Hebrews 11 v 6). That doesn't mean God doesn't love you, He loves you, but He may not be pleased with your walk. We are to walk by faith, not by sight (2 Corinthians 5 v 7). So if you're walking by faith you are not walking by sight.

Your faith is fueled by focusing on God's Word. Keep your eyes on the Word of God until it is more real inside you than anything else around you. If you do, you'll overcome and walk your way across all the storms of life!

I declare "Sharp focus as you hear and give your attention to God's Word, in Jesus Name"

Apostles' Doctrine

Acts 2 v 42: "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers".

Romans 6 v 17: "But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine to which you were delivered".

1 Timothy 4 v 16: "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you".

Philippians 2 v 16: "holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or laboured in vain".

Week 16 Dwell In You Richly

COCCASON?

"Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord". (Colossians $3 \ v \ 16$)

In the Old Testament they were under the 'old system', they had to bring animals to sacrifice for the atonement (covering) of their sin. However the first system has been replaced with a new and better system ordained by God and sealed by the blood of His Son Jesus Christ. Paul writes in Romans 6 v 17: "But God be thanked that though you were slaves of sin, yet you obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine (system of Truth) to which you were delivered. And having been set free from sin, you became slaves of righteousness".

Paul systematically delivered a 'form of doctrine' and those who obeyed from the heart were set free from sin and became slaves of righteousness. Paul then encouraged those in Philippi and I encourage you to obey from the heart the Words God has spoken directly to you and don't let them go.

Philippians 2 v 15: "... the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom you shine as lights in the World" v16: "Holding fast (embracing) the Word of life". Perhaps you let some of the Words God has spoken to you drop, be reassured, anything God has spoken to you are eternal. God's Words are living and active, His Words don't lie or die, because there is no rot in the spirit.

Let the Word of God dwell in you richly (Colossians 3 v 16). If there can be a rich measure of God's Word in you, there can also be a low measure of Word in you. Paul said, let the Word 'dwell richly'. The measure within you can grow or diminish! Take heed to ensure your heart is becoming richer and richer in the Word on a daily basis.

When you have a rich measure of Word invested into your heart, you are giving God more to work with in your life.

Before I was married I didn't keep much food supplies in my pantry, usually my food stock levels were very low, my shelves were more or less empty most of the time. If a very good chef came over, he could still create something even though my shelves weren't well stocked. But if I had plenty of the best ingredients and supplies on my shelves, then the

chef would be able to produce something great with the richer measure of ingredients in my pantry.

Paul is telling you to ensure the shelves of your heart, the pantry of your spirit are so well stocked up with the Word, so that the Holy Spirit can serve up something so abundant and rich in your life and family's life. I like what Dr David Yonggi Cho said: "Logos (Word) is like rice, Rhema (spoken ignited by the Spirit Word) is like cooked rice, we need the Holy Spirit to cook the Logos and give us Rhema rice to eat and digest within".

The Holy Spirit is so good, He will work with what we got on our shelves, but if we give Him more to work with, our lives will show the evidence of that.

*Week 17*Beyond The Flesh

"Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ". (1 Thessalonians 5 v 23)

Set your mind on things above, not on earthly things (Colossians 3 v 2). Take time to study God's Word, meditate on sound doctrine and let it change you from the inside out, not from the outside in!

There is a version of Christianity that God can not tolerate and that is 'luke-warm Christianity' (Revelation 3 v 16). There are too many believers that are 'hot' on the outside, but 'frozen' on the inside, they have a form of godliness but deny the power of God.

Jeremiah the prophet said "...His Word was in mine heart as a burning fire, shut up in my bones..." (Jeremiah 20 v 9). Jeremiah didn't have surface level Christianity, Jeremiah went beyond the flesh and he allowed God's Word to transform his life through and through.

Romans 12 v 2 "and be not conformed to this world: but be transformed (Greek: metamorphosis) by the renewing of your mind". Doctrine delivered to you through the apostles will radically transform and transfigure you, like Jesus on the Mount.

God made man's spirit to be the supreme part of his constitution, whereby man was designed to be led by the spirit. The 'body' and the 'soul' are the inferior sections of the human nature, that look toward the world and time.

1 Thessalonians 5 v 23 (AMPC): "And may the God of peace Himself sanctify you through and through [separate you from profane things, make you pure and wholly consecrated to God]; and may your spirit and soul and body be preserved sound and complete [and found] blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ (the Messiah)".

In James Stalker's book 'The Life of St. Paul', Reverend James clearly explains the very real internal battles we face between our flesh and spirit. He explains, after the fall of the human nature, man gave place for the body and the soul to take the place of the spirit. The flesh side of man, took possession of the throne, that was once occupied by the spirit side of man

and as a result the flesh began to completely rule the life of a man. While the side of man (the spirit) that looks toward God and eternity, was dethroned and reduced to a condition of inefficiency and death.

The good news is, you can conquer your flesh because Christ restored the lost predominance of the spirit of man by taking possession of it by His own Spirit. When you got born again, you ceased to be carnal and became spiritual and are led by the Spirit of God. However, your flesh does not indeed easily submit to the loss of its supremacy! It clogs and obstructs your spirit and fights to regain possession of the throne of your life.

God understands your internal battle, He knows your frame and the tendencies of the flesh (Psalm 103 v 14), and He knows exactly what you need to do to ensure your spirit man remains the supreme part of your life, whereby you are led by the Spirit not by your flesh.

Week 18 Thermometer Or Thermostat



"The end and culmination of all things is near Therefore, be sound-minded + self-controlled for the purpose of prayer [staying balanced and focused on the things of God so that your communication will be clear reasonable, specific & pleasing to Him]". (1 Peter 4 v 7 AMP)

You are to be sound minded in these end of days. Your life will not change until your mind changes. Your life always follows your mind's renewal. Proverbs 23 v 7: "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he".

A big lie is, thoughts are something you can't control, people say things like: "my mind has a mind of its own...". The truth is you choose what goes through your head! You determine what is in your head every single day.

The blessed man outlined in Psalm 1, is blessed because he wakes up in the morning and tells his mind what his mind is going to think upon. Psalm 1 v 1: "Blessed is the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful" v2: "But his delight is in the law of the Lord, And in His law he meditates day and night".

I can control my car, but the moment I can't, I take it to the mechanic. I say that to say this, the idea you can't control your mind, the idea that your mind has a mind of it's own, is to say you are subject to the mind! But truth be told, you choose what goes through your mind. Philippians 4 v 8: "..whatever things are true, noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy - mediate on these things".

Your mind is either a thermometer which reflects the temperature of life or your mind is a thermostat which changes the temperature of your life. You are to effect things, things are not to effect you! You are anointed to change things, not things change you!

1 Thessalonians 4 v 9 "concerning brotherly love you have no need that I should write... for you yourselves are taught by God to love one another". If you let God, who is 'Love' He will personally teach you how to love others like He does.

1 Thessalonians 4 v 10: "And indeed you do so toward all the brethren who are in all Macedonia. But we urge you brethren, that

you increase more and more". The Love of God should be on the increase, more love and less judgement.

1 Thessalonians 4 v 11 "...lead a quiet life (how?) mind your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded you". Notice the result: verse 12 "that you may walk properly toward those who are outside, and that you may lack nothing".

The 'quiet life' is the prosperous life. You have got to watch your peace levels! How? Mind your own business! You turn up the noise levels in your life when you get involved in other people's noise, other people's business.

You determine the thoughts you think! Remind your mind, it serves your spirit, you are the captain of your own ship, therefore you chose the thoughts you think on.

REFLECTION

Psalm 139 v 1 - 2: "O Lord, You have searched me and known *me.* You know my sitting down and my rising up; You understand my thought afar off. *But let each one examine his own work, and then he will have rejoicing"*.

Fellowship

COURSE OF THE PARTY OF THE PART

Psalm 133 v 1: "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!"

1 John 1 v 7: "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin".

Hebrews 10 v 25: "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching".

Week 19 Serving Together As One

COCCASON?

"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in UNITY! It is like the precious ointment (anointing oil) upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's (high priest's) beard, that went down to the skirts of his garments".

(Psalm 133 v 1)

When you unite with those God has called you to, there is unrestricted anointing from Jesus your High Priest that flows to His body (you and me). The 'anointing' is attracted to unity, God commands 'the blessing' on any people that unite and dwell together in unity. No wonder the devil wants to divide your family, home and life. No wonder the devil wants you fussing and fighting other people.

Instead of competing with others, remain full of faith and the Holy Ghost serving others with gladness (Acts 6 v 5). God has assigned the corporate church of Jesus Christ to occupy and do business on the earth until Jesus returns. In order to fulfil this assignment, I must play my part and you must play your part individually and corporately.

Jesus said in John 17 v 21: "...that they all may be one as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us...". Can you imagine the anointing that would flow from the body of Christ, if all were one with Jesus and one with another. The early church accomplished so much because they were united in spirit and soul (Acts 4 v 32). Can you imagine the souls saved, the miracles, prophecies and words spoken if the body of Christ would serve together as one.

Imagine the unstoppable anointing that would come upon the people as we pray together as one. As we serve united as one, we will see the most glorious times of the church age, just like Jesus prayed we would. At the beginning of the early church, the believers were in one accord in one place and suddenly there came a sound from heaven like a mighty rushing wind, it filled the place where they were one (Acts 2 v 1).

In John 3 v 34 we see Jesus was given the Holy Spirit without measure. In Romans 12 v 1 - 3, we see each of us have been given the 'measure of faith' needed to cover our own personal and ministerial assignments. However, there is more involved than just our own personal lives and assignments.

We have a world to reach, you and I are the end time generation to see the greatest harvest of souls.


In Ephesians 4 v 13 it says, when we all come together in the unity of the faith, we have 'the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ'. In order words, when we all 1. Serve the purposes of God and 2. Unite together and function as one, then we will begin to see ministries functioning in the fullness of their calling.

The enemy can not stop or overcome the full measure of Jesus flowing from the church that serves together as one! Continue to serve in your local church and march right over all enemies in the fullness of the power of Jesus and then we will bring the church age to the most glorious close before Jesus returns. I declare: "Fully Functioning Church In Jesus Name"

Week 20 Correctly Discerning The Body



"For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves. That is why many among you are weak and sick, and a number of you have fallen asleep". (1 Corinthians 11 v 29 - 30)

When a believer is weak and worn out, sick, diseased or dies prematurely, there is a reason why. For many it is because they do not disærn the body of Christ correctly. I realise the apostle Paul was talking about the body of Jesus and the blood He shed to redeem humanity, but he was also talking about rightly disærning the church of Jesus Christ (the body of Christ).

Many do not disærn their place, many do not disærn other people's place in the body of Christ and as a result many are worn out, weak, sick and struggling with finances. The Word reveals one of the reasons why many have problems double parked in their life, they wrongly discern their place and other people's place in the church.

Psalm 91 v 16: "With long life I will satisfy him, And show him My salvation". Why are Christians dying in their mid forties, fifties and sixties? God's Word reveals a reason; most don't recognise their place or other people's place in the body of Christ. Yet most would never want to even consider that could be a reason for their problem.

Mark 6 v 1: "He went out from there and came to His own country." Jesus had very powerful things happen in the place He ministered before going to His own country. The women with the issue of blood got healed, He raised the ruler of the synagogue's daughter from the dead.

Truly amazing things happened and no doubt Jesus was excited to take God's power to His town also, yet in Mark 6 v 2 - 5, we see Jesus could do no mighty work, except heal a few sick (meaning 'minor illnesses'). The Word states: "He could not", which means He tried to but couldn't. If He didn't try it would have said, "He, didn't even try or bother".

Why was Jesus limited in His own town? Was it because He lost His power? Was it because kryptonite was there? No! The issue was a lack of honour.

Many in Jesus' home town could not get past the fact "..we know this guy, that is Mary's boy, He worked with his dad the

carpenter, He helped make a chair for me..". One of the main reasons many among them stayed sick and kept their problems, was they wrongly discerned Jesus' place and purpose in their lives. Not recognising Jesus' place cost them, it cost them keeping their sickness, because they got too familiar with Jesus.

If wrongly discerning your place and other people's place in the body of Christ, is a main reason why many are weak and without, then rightly discerning the body of Christ will strengthen you, reinvigorate your health, kept you strong and cause you to flourish, in Jesus Name.

Psalm 92 v 13: "Those who are planted in the house of the LORD Shall flourish in the courts of our God".

*Week 21*Supernatural Associations



"He who walks with wise men will be wise, But the companion of fools will be destroyed". (Proverbs 13 v 20)

If you get around the wrong people, their influence will try to talk you out of your faith and out of all the great and grand things God has said He will do in and through you. However, if you get around people of the spirit, they will speak to the deep deposit of Christ on the inside of you that releases your potential.

Paul said "...know no man after the flesh..." (2 Corinthians 5 v 16). In other words, don't just know people after their appearance but by the spirit, because there are people who will feed your fear and there are those who God will use to feed your faith.

When Mary got around Elisabeth, Luke 1 v 41 says: "when Elisabeth heard the salutation of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb; and Elisabeth was filled with the Holy Ghost". There are people who will cause the dream and vision on the inside of you to leap, but the wrong associations will cause you to abort what you are carrying. Therefore watch your associations.

When Saul of Tarsus needed a life change, God brought a man into his life called Ananias (Acts 9). God told Ananias to lay his hands on Saul and in Acts 9 v 18 it says "the scales fell off Saul's eyes...". You need an Ananias, someone who will pray and talk to you and help you see things the way you ought to see them. You are blessed when God brings into your life someone who can help you see right!

When it was time for Paul to start preaching, no one would give him the opportunity. People were afraid of Paul, after all he had persecuted and killed Christians. Paul had no credibility in the church, no one would open their pulpit to him. Can you imagine, the man who carried two thirds of the New Testament within his spirit, yet couldn't get an opportunity to preach in any church gathering.

But there was a man called Barnabas whose name means 'son of reconciliation' considered Paul after the spirit and not the flesh. Barnabas discerned God's hand was mighty on Paul, and that God had separated him to be his representative.

Barnabas used his clout, influence and credibility to get Paul who was without credibility into certain places. Barnabas was

a bridge for Paul, and as a result Paul got to go places that he could never have gotten himself if it wasn't for God using Barnabas.

In 2 Corinthians 7 v 5, when Paul went through trouble he said: "...we were troubled on every side, without were fighting, within were fears...". No doubt Paul wanted to quit and throw in the towel but "nevertheless God sent Titus to encourage me" (2 Corinthians 7 v 6).

Titus means: 'honour, one who carries a message'. Expect people who carry a word of encouragement to come into your life at the right time to encourage you not to quit! God has people who will be used to knock the scales off of your eyes, people who be used to bring you into places that you could never get into by yourself!

Expect supernatural God given associations.

Breaking of Bread

Luke 22 v 19: "And He took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me"."

1 Corinthians 11 v 23 - 26: "...on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes".

Week 22 'Communion' A Meal To Remember

COCCOSO S

"do this in remembrance of Me." In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me".

(1 Corinthians 11 v 24 - 25)

The last super that Jesus had with His disciples is so significant to our faith, we need to be watchful in the manner we approach it. Paul told those in Corinth "…let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup" (1 Corinthians 11 v 28). The communion meal is not to be taken in a common manner, it should not be approached without understanding of what is involved.

Most weddings have a reception meal and party after the wedding ceremony, similarly at a traditional covenant ceremony, there is a meal which completes the covenant union. The loaf of bread is broken in two and fed to each covenant partner, and then they serve each other wine.

In the new covenant with Christ, in the place of the animals and blood, bread and wine is served. In Genesis 49 v 11, wine is referred to as 'the blood of grapes' and it represents our own lifeblood and the bread represents our flesh.

When two individuals exchange bread and wine when entering a covenant partnership, they are saying, "this is symbolic of my body and I am now putting it in you. The wine is symbolic of my blood which is now your blood. I am in you and you are in me, we are now one together with a new nature".

After Jesus took, gave thanks and broke the bread, He gave it to them saying "...this is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me" (Luke 22 v 19). People in the world drink to forget, but Jesus told His disciples to drink to remember! This is exactly how you are totake the communion meal, you are to eat and drink to remember how lost you were with out Jesus and what God has done for you! What Jesus has done for you is far greater than what you could ever do for yourself.

The communion meal is supposed to invoke memories. We remember how lost and arrogant we were, we remember how low and depressed we were. We remember how blind and far

gone we were without Jesus, and we also remember all that God has done for us!

Psalm 103 v 2: "Bless the LORD, O my soul, And forget not all His benefits" verse 3: "Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases" verse 4: "Who redeems your life from destruction, Who crowns you with lovingkindness and tender mercies" verse 5: "Who satisfies your mouth with good things, So that your youth is renewed like the eagle's".

Week 23 Passover Meal

"they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it. Then they shall eat the flesh on that night; roasted in fire, with unleavened bread and with bitter herbs they shall eat it. Do not eat it raw, nor boiled at all with water, but roasted in fire—its head with its legs and its entrails". (Exodus 12 v 7 - 9)

On the day of 'Passover' Jesus purposefully had His last super with His disciples, so that He could institute the communion meal. At the first Passover meal, God gave clear instructions: "..slay a lamb for your house, take the blood of the lamb and paint it on the side posts of your door and over the top post of the door". (Exodus 12 v 7).

The entrance to their home would be covered and surrounded by the blood, but the blood was never applied on the threshold, because the blood is never to be trampled on.

God told them, the death angel will see the blood on their home and will passover the houses that applied the blood. In other words; where there has been an application of blood, death will not be able to enter. The spirit of death can not cross the blood line.

If the Old Testament Passover meal had that kind of power when eaten, how much more power does the New Testament communion meal carry today. Miracles happen at the Passover meal!

Paul told the Romans: "For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death" (Romans 8 v 2). Because of the power of the blood of Jesus, death can not cross the blood line. If death can't cross the bloodline, we know neither can sickness or disease! There is supernatural power at the Lord's table!

God told them "..eat the lamb at Passover, roasted in fire, don't boil the lamb in water, all of it is to be roasted with fire..." (Exodus 12 v 8 - 9). Jesus our Passover Lamb died and felt the flames, Paul wrote to the Corinthians saying: "Therefore purge out the old leaven, that you may be a new lump, since you truly are unleavened. For indeed Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us". In Egypt God told them "not to boil the lamb in water", we are not to water down the

message, we are to boldly testify about the power of the blood, sing about the blood of Jesus, because it is through the blood we overcome (Revelation 12 v 11).

In all four gospel accounts of the upper room passover meal, both bread and wine are recorded as being present, however there is no mention of lamb in the meal. Unlike in the Old Testament, lamb was always mentioned.

Why was lamb not mention, why was no lamb on the table in the communion meal in the New Testament? Because the Lamb Jesus Christ, was sitting at the table not on the table. Just twenty four hours later Jesus would be dragged out, nailed on a tree and crucified. Then three days later, raised from the dead having purchased our eternal redemption.

Our living Christ Jesus always manifests Himself with all His blessings at the communion table, not on the table. Hebrews 10 v 10: "By that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all". God's promises are activated in our lives when we eat the communion meal in faith.

Week 24 Communion Our Covenant Proclamation



"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever". (Psalm 23 v 5 - 6)

Communion is our 'Covenant Proclamation' to everyone around "this is what Jesus did for you, His body was broken and He shed His blood for you".

When we take communion, we proclaim to all demons of hell "you better back off now, we are untouchable because of the blood". God's children couldn't leave Egypt until the lamb's blood was applied over their life and after the lamb got in them. The

'spirit of death' passed over all the homes where the blood was applied.

Get full of the Lamb and apply the blood of Jesus with your mouth (the hyssop branch of the New Testament). Proclaim your covenant, declare your redemption when you take communion.

The Psalmist David proclaimed "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; My cup runs over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever". (Psalm $23 \ v \ 5 - 6$).

Jesus prepared the communion table for us, and it is at the communion table He anoints us!

Jesus is always present at the communion table.

There is 'Overflow' for you at the table of the Lord!

There is 'Goodness and Mercy' for you the table of the Lord!

There is 'Healing' for you at the table of the Lord!

There is 'Forgiveness' for you at the table of the Lord!

There is 'Deliverance' for you at the table of the Lord!

There is 'Provision' for you at the table of the Lord!

There is 'Blessing' for you at the table of the Lord!

We have the cup of the new wine of the new covenant. The communion meal not only includes the cup of blessing, this is a meal where God restores things. It is a meal of restoration "He restores my soul, He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name's sake" Psalm 23 v 3.

When you proclaim and partake of the communion meal in faith, it activates the precious promises God has for you.

REFLECTION

Romans 12 v 3: "For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith".

Prayer

Luke 11 v 2 (AMPC): "When you pray, say: Our Father Who is in heaven, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come. Your will be done [held holy and revered] on earth as it is in heaven".

James 5 v 16 (AMPC): "....The earnest (heartfelt, continued) prayer of a righteous man makes tremendous power available [dynamic in its working]".

Matthew 21 v 13: "And He said to them "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer', but you have made it a 'den of thieves'".

Isaiah 56 v 7: "...I will bring to My holy mountain, And make them joyful in My house of prayer. Their burnt offerings and their sacrifices Will be accepted on My altar; For My house shall be called a house of prayer for all nations".

Week 25 Who Not How

"When you pray, say: Our Father Who is in heaven, hallowed be Your name, Your kingdom come. Your will be done [held holy and revered] on earth as it is in heaven". (Luke 11 v 2 AMPC)

During our engagement, my wife and I wrote to each other a lot. At the time my wife spent the year in a wilderness ranch in Canada, while I studied at university in the UK. We communicated by letter and we still have stacks of letters we wrote each other today.

Do you know why we have stacks and stacks of letters and why we wrote each other daily? It wasn't because I discovered the joy of letter writing or because I love to write. I didn't write because I love to write, I wrote because I love Evangeline, my wife.

Prayer is like letter writing, God doesn't want us to fall in love with prayer, God wants us in love with the One we are praying to. When prayer is not enjoyable, the problem isn't prayer, the problem is your love for God. When you dread to pray, prayer isn't the issue, it is your love relationship with Him.

You don't have to love letter writing, but you should love the Person you are writing to. You don't have to love prayer, but prayer becomes very enjoyable when the Person you are talking to loves you and you love them. Prayer becomes enjoyable when you focus on Him, instead of what you are praying about.

Just like writing isn't reserved for professional writers or authors, prayer isn't just for those in ministry or the so called 'super spiritual elect' No! Prayer is for those in love with God.

In Luke 11 v 1 - 2, Jesus' disciples came to Him asking; "Teach us how to pray". Notice Jesus' response: "When you pray, pray like this: "Our Father Who is in heaven". The disciples were asking Jesus to teach them 'how to pray', but Jesus turns their focus from 'how to pray' to 'Who' they are praying to.

All other religions focus on principles, they focus on the rules of prayer; how to address deity, how long to pray, what to wear when you pray, what direction to pray in, instead of the one they are praying to. The disciples were asking "How do we address God?" and Jesus changed their focus from the rules

and principles of prayer to the Person of prayer. Christianity isn't about prayer principles, it is about a Person!

If you don't have a fresh flow of the anointing of God continually being poured into you, eventually you will burn out, for there will be no fuel in your tank! Don't become so sophisticated with the things you know, the doctrine you know, but remain so powerless! Don't forfeit your zeal and spiritual fire, don't become so refined and structured, so stuck in routines and formulas that you lose your passion and energy for God.

When Evangeline's letters arrived in the post, they weren't read like a bill, her letters were the first thing I opened when the post came. When you face something, His Word needs to be the first thing you open. Why? Because His Word is a letter from our Father to you.

I didn't read Evangeline's letters once or twice, I read them multiple times. Her letters represented her presence with me. God's Word is that to us, His Word is His presence. "....the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1 v 1).

Week 26 Prepared Through Prayer + Fasting

"The earnest (heartfelt, continued) prayer of a righteous man makes tremendous power available [dynamic in its working]". (James 5 v 16 AMPC)

Nothing much will avail until we pray, certain things will not happen until; heartfelt continual prayers are made. God is looking for compassionate intercessors, through whom He can cause them to give birth to the move of His Spirit, by prayer.

John the Baptist was a 'voice' that went ahead of Jesus, John's voice prepared the way for Jesus and ushered Him into the earth (it was done through prayer). John 1 v 23: "He said: "I

am, the voice of one crying in the wilderness "Make straight the way of the LORD" as the prophet Isaiah said".

There are paths to take by us all, plans for us to walk in, but there needs to be a 'voice' that goes before us. There needs to be people that prepare the way. Be the voice in the earth giving vent to the Voice of God and God's kingdom shall be advanced.

Noah didn't know the exact day when the flood would come, but he knew it was coming so he got prepared. We have a lot to look forward to, Jesus is coming back, but before He does there is much to be done and like Noah we too must get prepared.

Ephesians 3 v 20 (NLT) "Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think". All the things God will do in and through you must be prayed out before it is walked out. Not only that, prayer and fasting are the filling station of power for the believer. If you neglect to fast and pray, you also neglect to walk in full spiritual power available to you.

Paul told Timothy, there is a good fight of faith! Why? Because there are giants in every promised land. He told him "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses" 1 Timothy 6 v 12.

Part of fighting the good fight of faith is fasting and prayer, which allows you to lay hold of all that is yours in Christ. Faith lays hold, faith takes what God already said is yours. Ephesians 1 v 3 "All praise to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly realms because we are united with Christ".

Be grateful for the 'spiritual blessings in heavenly places', but you need them in earthly places also. Fasting and prayer are like the debit visa card and pin number in the spirit. Prayer lets you withdraw funds from the spiritual realm into the natural realm.

Fasting not only reminds your flesh it is not in charge, fasting also positions you to hear and receive what God has said and done. The combination of prayer and fasting is a supernatural force that provokes God to move on your behalf in a new and living way.

The most powerful creature on earth is the 'new creature' in Christ (2 Corinthians 5 v 17). What happens on earth depends on you! This is why prayer is vital, it isn't a religious activity, prayer is giving God a legal right to intervene here on earth. When you seek the Lord, your problem becomes a victim of your prayer.

What has God spoken to you concerning your life? You need to pray it out, lay it out, act it out and navigate it out. Make the vision plain (lay it out) and start moving in the direction of the vision (act it out). Your initial steps might not be earth shaking but you are taking action and God will honour your faith walk with mighty manifestations.

In your pursuit of all that God has promised, don't make the same mistake Eve made, she esteemed creation greater than the Creator! Reinhard Bonnke was interviewed, they said: "Evangelist, because of your devotion and faithfulness to God, it is amazing to see how God rewarded you with big crowds and buildings, platforms and TV ministry".

Reinhard replied "Brother my reward wasn't the crowds, buildings, stage, my reward was the presence of God". God is a rewarder, seek Him just for Him and enjoy all He has planned for you, your family and your nation.

Week 27 Abide, Ask Big and Step Out



"If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you". (John 15 v 7)

1 Timothy 1 v 19 (AMP) "keeping your faith [leaning completely on God with absolute trust and confidence in His guidance]...".

God isn't coming up with a plan as He goes, God isn't an ambulance going from one crash to the next, He is ahead of stuff, He is always ahead and He is with you! God told Jeremiah "...I am with you..." (Jeremiah 1 v 8). You are not in this by yourself, you didn't call yourself, He is your safe guidance.

God told Kenneth. E. Hagin "If you will teach people to follow their spirits, then they will receive help in every arena of life". Our spirit is a safe guide, so don't override it, you can trust your heart's witness! The heartnever gives an option, it only gives a knowing.

1 John 5 v 9: "If we receive the witness of men, the witness of God is greater; for this is the witness of God which He has testified of His Son". It is real easy to have a leading for someone else, it costs you nothing. You need to check on the inside of your heart before you do anything.

Either you are making all your decisions based on what happens in life and reacting the best you know how, or you are making all of your decisions based on what God has said and consequently living in response to God's Voice heard in prayer.

Paul said to those in Philippi, "Being confident of this very thing, that He Who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1 v 6). God completes what He has started, but He is in no way obligated to finish a work that He didn't start. Therefore you need to be confident that He was the One that started the work!

When reading the letters Paul wrote, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, the letters he wrote to Timothy and others, I have you noticed how many times he started them with saying: "I, Paul an apostle by the will of God".

Galatians 1 v 1: "Paul an Apostle (not by the hand of men, nor through men, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father who raised Himfrom the dead;)". Paul was saying, I am an apostle by the will of God, not by my will but His. Therefore I can be confident that God sent me, I didn't send myself.

The reason many churches, ministries, businesses fail; they never should have started in the first place. There is no foundation for their confidence, God never told them to start it. Ultimately they have no Word from the Lord to do it. If you do not have the Word from God to do it, there is no foundation for confidence. It is baseless and where there is no Word, there is no faith.

John 15 v 7: "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you". Jesus said we are not to ask outside of Him, we are to remain in Him, how? By letting His words abide richly in us. What you believe, speak and ask is core to your prayer life.

Before Jesus he aled blind Bartimaeus in Mark 10, Jesus asked him: "What do you want Me to do for you?" The blind man said to Him, "Rabboni, that I may receive my sight". Mark 10 v 51.

You would think it was obvious, what the blind man wanted. But the obvious does not obligate God to move, what moves God is faith filled prayer. Mark 10 v 52: "Then Jesus said tohim, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus on the road". He got healed,

because He asked for what He wanted! It was obvious but obvious doesn't obligate God.

Mark 6 v 48: "...He saw them straining at rowing, for the wind was against them. Now about the fourth watch of the night He came to them, walking on the sea, and would have passed them by". Jesus' disciples were in a storm, close to drowning and going under and Jesus would have passed them if they didn't call for Him.

If wasn't that Jesus didn't see them, He did, the Word says: "....He saw them straining...". Surely that would have been enough for Jesus to step in and help! No, Jesus doesn't force His anointing upon any one of us, even if the need is very real, He requires individuals to ask in faith. Once again the obvious does not obligate God to meet your need.

John 16 v 23: "And in that day you will ask Me nothing. Most assuredly, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in My name He will give you".

Faith requires a backbone not a wishbone, faith is gutsy! Your flesh wants comfort but your spirit is longing for adventure. Your flesh wants to stay in the boat, but your spirit is saying "call me out on the water". Abide, ask big and step out.

Week 28 The Heart Not Just The Apron



"But one thing is needed, and Mary has chosen that good part, which will not be taken away from her". (Luke 10 v 42)

John 13 v 6: "Then He came to Simon Peter. And Peter said to Him, "Lord, are You washing my feet?"" v7: "Jesus answered and said to him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but you will know after this." v8: "Peter said to Him, "You shall never wash my feet!" Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me." v9: "Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head!"".

Jesus told Peter, if he didn't allow Him to wash his feet, he would have no part with Him. What could you do that would make Jesus have no part with you? Murder? No. Adultery? Nope, the answer is, not letting Jesus bless your socks off!

Acts 3 v 20: (Christian Standard Bible) "seasons of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord". Do not be too busy to sit at His feet to wash your feet, allow Him to refresh and refuel you.

William Seymour once said: "Lord, dip me in the kerosene of Your Spirit and set my heart ablaze that I may burn for You".

The only disciple out of the twelve who we have recorded at the foot of the cross is John.

Why? John was more consumed with Jesus' love for him than his own love for Jesus.

Where were the others? Where was Peter? Peter was a casualty of condemnation. If you live consumed by your performance and your deeds, they will fail you. John on the other hand laid his head on the heart of God and recognised Jesus' love is unconditional, immeasurable, never failing, incorruptible and always available.

Jesus laid aside His garments and went foot level to serve His disciples, and later asked them "Do you know what I have done to you?" (John 13 v 12). Jesus was asking them if they understood what He was teaching them. He wasn't training them how to conduct a great 'foot washing service', He was showing them how to serve.

John 13 v 15: "For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you". Notice verse 17: "If you know these things,

blessed are you if you do them". The blessing of God is not a mystery, the blessing flows unhindered when you lay aside what you want and humble yourself and serve others. If you are too big to serve, you are too little to lead.

In John 12, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was raised from the dead. The Word says: "There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him" John 12 v 2.

Martha served, but really she went through the serving motions. Martha was the one with the apron on, but if serving results in an emotional melt down, you are missing the servant's heart. Luke 10 v 40: "Martha was distracted with much serving, and she approached Him and said, "Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Therefore tell her to help me.".

If you don't bring the heart only the apron, you are missing it. Mary on the other hand, took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil. (John $12\,\mathrm{v}$ 3).

The servant's heart takes no thought how much it costs, it understands ".....He rewards those who [earnestly and diligently] seek and serve Him" (Hebrew 11 v 6).

The very first thing Paul put on his curriculum vitae when writing the Romans was "Paul a bondservant of Jesus" (Romans 1 v 1).

When you consider all the things he did, all the visions he had, the revelations he received, how he was caught up to heaven, how he wrote thirteen letters of the New Testament, and yet he introduces himself as "I Paul a servant". Truly there is nothing that is above serving!

Week 29 Altered At The Altar



"O God, You are my God; Early will I seek You; My soul thirsts for You; My flesh longs for You, In a dry and thirsty land, Where there is no water". (Psalm 63 v 1)

God blessed Abraham and his descendants because he put God first at all times and in all places. Genesis 12 v 7: "Then the Lord appeared to Abram and said, "To your descendants I will give this land." And there he built an altar to the Lord, who had appeared to him" v8: "And he moved from there to the mountain east of Bethel, and he pitched his tent with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east; there he built an altar to the Lord and called on the name of the Lord".

Every time Abraham had an encounter with God, his first response was worship. In every new place he settled, the first thing Abraham did was build an altar unto the Lord. This didn't just happen once or twice, it happened over and over and over again. (Genesis $13 \ v \ 3 - 4$, Genesis $13 \ v \ 18$, Genesis $22 \ v \ 9$).

Throughout the scriptures we see Abraham setting up his tent and building an altar in front of it, so that the very first thing he sees when he wakes up and opens his door was the altar he built unto the Lord.

The altar was a place of worship, dedication, sacrifice and a place of fellowship and interaction with God. Each altar was a place Abraham built, it wasn't a place he found, it wasn't a place he stumbled upon, it wasn't a place he found by accident.

Abraham intentionally at every place he moved to made sure the very first thing he did was set up his tent in the direction of the altar he had built for God. Abraham was making a statement: "In every place and season I give God first place in my life".

Build into your life dedicated time with God, let worship unto God be the first thing you do. Psalm 63 v 1: "O God, You are my God; Early will I seek You; My soul thirsts for You; My flesh longs for You, In a dry and thirsty land, Where there is no water".

When you are hungry for God, you seek Him, when you are passive you make excuses. Do you remember when you first got on fire for the Lord? No sacrifice was too high, anything

that needed doing for God was a privilege and a joy, not a burden.

When you are hungry for God, you may make mistakes but you don't make excuses, you judge yourself and repent. If you want to keep the fire of God in your life burning hot, you have got to keep repentance in your life.

Many do not fall out of love with God, many fall out of repentance. Don't allow there to be un-confessed sin in your life. 1 John 1 v 9: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness".

The first thing Abraham did each morning was consult God at the alter. Each morning, he worshipped God, each morning he went to the place of dedication and interaction and Abraham was altered at the alter of the Lord.

Week 30 Watch Your Life

Cockson,

"Keep a close watch on how you live and on your teaching. Stay true to what is right for the sake of your own salvation and the salvation of those who hear you". (1 Timothy 4 v 16 NLT)

 $\mathbf{P}^{\text{aul instructed Timothy to keep a close watch on three things (1 Timothy 4 v 16):}$

- 1. How you live.
- 2. What you teach and the teachings you hear.
- 3. Stay true to what is right.

If you keep a watch on all three of these, you will frustrate the enemy and keep the door closed to him. The enemy will have no entrance into your life to destroy it. The devil doesn't come all at once and then suddenly destroy lives, no. It is the toleration of wrong things and letting them progress in your

life that destroys lives. Song of Solomon 2 v 15: "....The little foxes that spoil the vines, For our vines have tender grapes".

Never let the enemy dominate your thoughts. Guard your life and keep a close watch to ensure you give no place to the devil (Ephesians 4 v 27). If he has room in your life, it is because you gave it to him.

Watch how you live, not only with God but with others too. 1 Corinthians 10 v 32: "Give no offence, either to the Jews or to the Greeks or to the church of God". Don't give satan the pleasure of pulling the plug from your faith. He is always looking to drain the Word of God from your heart through offence. God wants you rooted and ground in love, satan wants you rooted in offence.

1 Corinthians 13 v 1 - 3: "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing"

Let the spirit of faith rise up strong within and lift up your voice and declare "All bitterness, un-forgiveness and offence be plucked up by the roots from my life and cast into the sea. I declare bitterness, offence and un-forgiveness will never contaminate my life again".

Declare it: "I shall live and not die and declare His goodness until I am fully satisfied and have completed my assignment here on earth".

REFLECTION

2 Corinthians 12 v 9: "And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me".

Acts 20 v 21: "Testifying both to the Jews, and also to the Greeks, repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ".

Philemon v 5: "Hearing of thy love and faith, which thou hast toward the Lord Jesus, and toward all saints".

Proverbs 3 v 5: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding, In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths".

Week 31 Your Faith Has Made You Whole



"For whatever is born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world, our faith". (1 John 5 v 4)

2 Chronicles 16 v 9: "For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong on behalf of those whose heart is loyal to Him...". God has always been looking for faith, He is currently looking for faith and when Jesus returns He will be looking for faith, Luke 18 v 8: "when the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth?".

If God has predestined who gets healed when and where, why is He looking for faith? Oral Roberts knew what he was saying when he said: "Every day miracles are going to you or past you". God's power is not assigned to anyone, it is assigned to those whose faith is towards God.

Jesus asked blind Bartimaus: "What do you want Me to do for you?" The blind man replied: "Rabboni, I may receive my sight" (Mark 10 v 51) The man asked to see what he had been believing for.

I imagine him saying: "I have been believing to see for a very long time, all I have ever known is darkness. I have heard about light but never seen it. Jesus I want to see what I have been believing for".

Then in Mark 10 v 52, Jesus tells him: "..." Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus on the road". The blind man got healed according to his faith! If your faith is according to your sight, it is going to be more of the same old, same old! Elevate your faith above what you are seeing, then God will bring your life up to the level you believe.

Jesus let this man see what he had been believing for. If you believe bigger then what you see, God will reward you by letting you see what you believe. Never bring your faith down to the level of your situation. Never bring your faith down to the level of your blindness, your faith is designed to bring your blindness to the level of your belief.

Notice Jesus went where blind Bartimaus' faith put Him. God goes where faith puts Him. People think God has already decided where He will go, but that is not the case. God lets your faith decide where He will go.

Psalm 27 v 13: "I would have lost heart, unless I had believed That I would see the goodness of the LORD In the land of the living".

When Paul and Silas were in prison, they prayed and sang praises to God and the doors flung open (Acts 16 v 25). Most people would have ran saying: "brilliant this is our exit, our great escape". Not Paul and Silas, their freedom wasn't determined by location or situation, they knew their freedom was secured and settled in Christ and Christ alone.

Paul's faith toward God was so strong, they believed they were already out of prison before the prison doors flung open. When 'In Christ' is more real then 'In this world', it doesn't matter what this world throws at you, it will not be able to derail you from your freedom in Christ.

Before any circumstance changes, you can exit whatever you might be in right now. That is faith and that is what a deep consciousness of God will do for you. Decide the exit, don't let circumstances pave your exit!

Come to the place in your spirit where you recognise "...my faith toward God is in charge".

Paul and Silas contended for victory, not escape! True victory isn't running for your life, true victory is getting all the prisoners saved, then winning the prison keeper to the Lord and establishing a church. Victory is seeing the whole picture and believing all things are possible for those who believe God.

Week 32 Seeing Correctly

"Men's hearts failing them for fear, and for looking after those things which are coming on the earth, for the powers of heaven shall be shaken". (Luke 21 v 26)

Refuse to allow what your eyes see determine what your heart believes. Men's hearts are failing because of two things: fear and looking at the things which are coming on the earth!

If there was ever a time to guard what you see and manage your thoughts it is today! You can manage your finances, clean out your car and sort your garage, but if your mind is a cluttered mess, very soon your life will line up to the cluttered mess of your mind. How messy your mind is will result in how messy your life will be. Sooner or later life will begin to line up to what is going on in your head.

The average person thinks 65,000 thoughts every single day, 90% of which are repetition, thoughts of yesterday. Only 10% of your thoughts today are new thoughts. Your future must be more important than your present, if not you will never change your present to get to your future. If you are not changing you have lost sight of your vision.

If Joseph walked by sight instead of his vision he would have quit. Joseph didn't act like a prisoner, Joseph acted like a prinœ in prison and as a result they put him in charge of the whole prison. Joseph didn't act like a slave, he acted like a prinœ, so they made him the head of the slaves.

Don't drop to where you are at, hold fast to the vision God gave you. Like Joseph, refuse to allow what your eyes see determine what your heart believes.

The reason why most quit on vision, isn't because the vision wasn't from God, but because they began to function by their eyes instead of their heart. Sight is the function of the eyes, while 'vision' is the function of the heart. Sight is the ability to see things as they are, but vision is the ability to see things as they could be.

Your next season is as bright as the vision God has for you. It is one thing for God to behold that image, but you must see it too. It isn't enough to just be called to something, you must

also see it with the eyes of your spirit. God will always give you and me opportunities to see the next level.

Jeremiah 1 v 11 - 12 (NCV) "Moreover the word of the LORD came to me, saying, "Jeremiah, what you see?" And I said, "I see a branch of an almond tree". Then the LORD said to me, "You have seen well, for I am ready to perform My word".

Week 33 Precious Seed Equals Doubtless Harvest



"He that goes forth... bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his harvest with him".

(Psalm 126 v 26)

Tithing and giving offerings is an act of faith toward God, and faith is the vehicle to enforce the victory Jesus has done in breaking the curse and rebuking the devourer for our sakes. In the area of finances, we are to walk by faith and not by sight. Ecclesiastes 11 v 4 says: "He that observes the wind shall not sow, and he that regards the clouds shall not reap".

Tithe in faith knowing God can multiple and do more with 10% in His hands than you can with 100% in your hands. 90%

with God's blessing on it goes further then 100% without. It isn't the tithe that enacts the blessing of God, it is your faith that enacts the blessing of God.

When you give, God gets whatever you put in the gift. He gets the love you put in it, He gets the obedience and the devotion you put in the gift sown. God gets the willingness and the faith you put in it.

It isn't just the gift you gave, it is what you put in it. If the financial gift you have sown took no faith or trust in God to give it, if it took no honour or obedience to give it, then God doesn't get anything.

Mark 12 v 41 - 44: "Jesus sat over against the treasury and beheld how the people cast money in... and there came a certain poor widow and she threw in two mites...and He called unto Him His disciples, and said unto them "this poor widow has cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury: For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living".

The widow women's precious gift got Jesus' attention, so much so He told His disciples "...pay attention everyone, see this women I want to talk about her and her actions...".

What moved Jesus wasn't just her giving, but it was how she gave, she gave in faith. She didn't stop and calculate what she didn't have, she boldly gave all that she had expecting God to take care of her in return.

Throughout Scripture we see example after example of people sowing precious seed and getting God's attention. Psalm 126 v 26 (KJ): "He that goes forth... bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his harvest with him". Precious seed sown, results in a doubtless harvest.

God really isn't as interested in the seed sown, as He is the faith it took to sow the seed. If the seed you have sown took no faith toward God to give it, if it took no honour or obedience to give it, then God doesn't get anything. But the moment you get into the realm of 'precious' with your giving, that is the moment you get into the realm of doubtless harvest.

In the Old Testament it was tradition for someone to offer up a lamb for sacrifice when entering the kingship. That was the commonly understood and expected offering that everybody did. But when Solomon returned as King notice what he did.

2 Chronicles 1 v 6: "in front of the tabernacle, Solomon went up to the bronze altar in the Lord's presence and sacrificed 1,000 burnt offerings on it". Solomon went over and above the norm, he offered one thousand 'choiœ sheep'.

I can only imagine what the accountants thought, or what the business men in the community were thinking "you are crushing our nation financially, we need those sheep, they are the choice sheep Solomon!!! Is it really necessary to give 1,000....".

Typically the 'choice sheep' were sheep used to make other sheep. We are talking about valuable livestock. It was

precious seed, and that night God appeared to Solomon asking him "What do want? Ask and I will give it to you!" (2 Chronicles 1 v 7).

Remember God gets the love, obedience, honour, devotion, willingness and faith you put in the gift you are giving. It isn't just the gift you give, it is what you put in it. Sow seeds that are precious to you and God will cause you to reap a doubtless harvest!

REFLECTION

1 Peter 1 v 13: "Therefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and rest your hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ".

Doctrine of Baptisms

The state of the s

1 Corinthians 12 v 13: "For by one Spirit we were all baptised into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit".

Matthew 28 v 19: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit".

Matthew 3 v 11: "I indeed baptise you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire".

Week 34 Baptised Into Christ



"For by one Spirit we were all baptised into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit". (1 Corinthians 12 v 13)

- There are three distinct baptisms shown in the scriptures:

 1. The Holy Spirit baptises you into Jesus, when you get born again.
- 2. The disciples baptise you into water, when you publicly declare your faith.
- 3. Jesus baptises you in the Holy Spirit and Fire.

At the very beginning of Jesus' life, we see the Holy Spirit coming upon people and moving through Him. After Mary was told she will conceive and bring forth a Son and shall call His name Jesus, she asked: "How can this be?", the angel

answered "...the Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you...", Luke 1 v 35.

The Holy Spirit came upon Anna and Simeon when they prophesied in Luke 2 v 25. The Bible says Zacharias and Elizabeth were filled with the Holy Spirit (Luke 1 v 41). The angel told Zacharias in Luke 1 v 15: "..he (John the Baptist) will also be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb".

The Spirit of God told John the Baptist, when you see the One who the Holy Spirit comes on Him and remains, that is the Messiah. John 1 v 33: "Upon whom you see the Spirit descending and remaining on Him, this is He who baptises with the Holy Spirit".

Holy Spirit was sent to empower you and to take you beyond the natural. Jesus' first miracle in John 2 involved six full water pots, which is a prophetic picture of God's people filled with the Holy Spirit. Amazing things take place when you allow the Holy Spirit to baptise you into Jesus.

In John 2 Jesus turned water into wine, the grapevines were not planted, there was no growing time, no harvesting time, there was no fermenting or bottling time. Natural processes are skipped when miracles take place. Those that are baptised into Jesus (born again children of God) are not limited to natural processes.

The world doesn't have the answers for the problems of men! Despite all the medication and all the access people have to health care, researchers tell us more people are committing suicide, those on anti-depressants are higher than ever, cancer rate is on the increase and there are more overdoses than there has ever been.

People need the power and the presence of the Holy Spirit. In the Old Testament the Holy Spirit would move and then leave, but in the New Testament He doesn't just come upon us, He fills to the full and remains. John 14 v 16: "And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Helper, that He may abide with you forever".

Week 35 Outward Sign of An Inward Change

"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". (Matthew $28 \ v \ 19$)

Water baptism is a physical act that should indelibly mark the mind of the person being baptised, with the reality of their union with Jesus Christ. Water baptism symbolises the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ and our identification with Him in them. Water baptism is an outward sign and testimony of an inward change.

Jesus said: "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost"

(Matthew 28 v 19). Water baptism is not the baptism that saves, it is only the precious blood of Jesus that saves. Water baptism is an experience after salvation to confirm and strengthen your commitment to live a godly life.

The baptismal waters represent a burial ground. When you are buried with Christ in baptism, you are proclaiming to heaven, earth and hell that the old you no longer exists!

The Apostle Paul said: "I consider myself as having died and now I am enjoying a second existence which is simply Jesus using my body" Galatians 2 v 20 (Distilled Translation).

The full immersion into water signifies burial and the coming up out of the water signifies being raised to new life in Christ Jesus. No matter your former sin and failure, no matter your former performance, you are free from your former master 'sin'. Romans 6 v 18 (TPT): ".....You have left bondage and now God's perfect righteousness holds power over you are His loving servant".

Luke 3 v 21 - 22, after Jesus was water baptised and prayed, the heaven was open and the Holy Spirit descended upon Him and a Voice from heaven spoke "You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased".

The very next thing we see is Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit and was led by The Spirit (Luke 4 v 1). What ever you are full of, you will be led by.

The prerequisite to being led by the Spirit of God is being baptised into Christ, or in other words, being a son or daughter of God. Romans 8 v 14 says: "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God".

*Week 36*Holy Ghost Fire

COCCOSION .

"I indeed baptise you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire". (Matthew~3~v~11)

When the fire of God comes on you, you are not timid, you are bold! You are not concerned about your own reputation, you don't care what people think! The fire of the Holy Spirit supersedes all of your concerns.

If you have become timid, when normally you were passionate and bold, it is a sign your fire has almost gone out and you need to stir it up. If you have gone from 'roaring' to 'ash covered' you need to fan into flame your inner flame.

2 Timothy 1 v 6 - 7 (AMPC): "....I would remind you to stir up (rekindle the embers of, fan the flame of, and keep burning) the [gracious] gift of God, [the inner fire] that is in you by means of the laying on of my hands [with those of the elders at your ordination]". Verse 7: "For God did not give us a spirit of timidity.....but [He has given us a spirit] of power and of love and of calm and well-balanced mind and discipline and self-control". Verse 8: "Do not blush or be ashamed then, to testify to and for our Lord.".

Peter was ashamed to testify to and for the Lord Jesus in front of a young girl at a camp fire, but in Acts 2 v 14, we see Peter stepping forward in boldness to declare the gospel in front of three thousand men who were mocking him and the other disciples.

Without a microphone, no bull horn and with no invitation, Peter steps forward and arrests the crowd with his words, Peter spoke with fire power! He got about half way through his sermon and the crowd of mockers were so provoked in their hearts they asked: "what must we do to be saved?"

Acts 2 v 37: "Peter's words pierced their hearts, and they said to him and to the other apostles, "Brothers, what should we do?" v38: "Peter replied, "Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit".

Peter was weak and timid, but when the Holy Spirit filled him, all timidity was removed. When you received the baptism of the Holy Spirit and fire, you received power and boldness to bear witness to the Truth.

People ask "why can't you Christians just keep your beliefs to yourself...", because it is against our beliefs to keep our beliefs to ourselves. We need to put fire in our sermon or put the sermon in the fire!

The Holy Spirit not only gives you boldness, He leads. Many confuse the leadings of their soul with the leadings of their spirit. Proverbs 14 v 12: "There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death". This is why the Word of God is so vital, because it will discern between soul and spirit.

Hebrews 4 v 12: "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart". The spirit and the soul are not the same, Paul said they can be divided with the Word.

The Spirit of God and the Word of God always agree, anytime the Spirit of God speaks it will always be in line with the Word. 1 Corinthians 14 v 10: "There are, it may be, so many kinds of voices in the world, and none of them is without meaning". There are many voices in the world, but we are to follow the Voice of the Spirit who always leads in line with what God has said in the Word.

1 Thessalonians 5 v 21 says "Test all things; hold fast what is good". Don't accept anything without examining it in light of

the Word of God. The Holy Spirit always works with the Word.

The Bible is our 'map', but the Holy Spirit is our 'Guide'. I remember travelling to Kolkata India for the first time, I was thankful for my map on my phone, but I was also really thankful for my guide. My guide was someone who knew the city roads really well and could easily show me all the things that I would have missed in the city.

Having a map was good, but having a guide who knew the map and knew the city, opened up Kolkata to me in a way the map couldn't. The 'map' is the Word of God and the 'guide' is the Holy Spirit. My guide used the same map I was using, but understood maps much better then I could. It is the same with the Holy Spirit, He leads and guides us with the 'map' The Word of God!

When you sow speaking to God in prayer, you shall reap a harvest of hearing from God.

Laying on of Hands

Mark 16 v 17 - 18: "And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover".

Luke 11 v 20: "Go But if I cast out demons with the finger of God, surely the kingdom of God has come upon you".

Matthew 8 v 3: "Jesus put out His hand and touched him saying "I am willing, be cleansed". Immediately his leprosy was cleansed".

Week 37 Contact And Transmission



"And these signs shall follow them that believe...they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover". (Mark 16 v 17 - 18)

Jesus never lies and He said believers will lay their hands on the sick and they would recover. Through the laying on of hands the healing power of God is released, it is through the laying on of hands the gifts and the callings of God are stirred up in your heart.

Moses laid his hands on Joshua and the 'spirit of wisdom' came upon him, Deuteronomy 34 v 9: "...Joshua son of Nun was filled with the spirit of wisdom because Moses had laid his hands on him...". Through the laying on of hands something is imparted. Some things you learn from information and then there are things you get from impartation.

My wife and I met at Rhema Bible Training Centre, Kenneth E. Hagin would walk around and lay hands on people. During those times, there were significant impartations of the Holy Spirit, you could physically feel the anointing.

The anointing is tangible and if you will receive it by faith, you will sense it when transmitted. When it comes to receiving healing, it isn't so much 'faith for healing' but rather 'faith in the power of God' (anointing of God). The anointing power of God removes burdens and destroys the yoke (Isaiah 10 v 27), it removes, restores and recovers!

In Jesus' teaching ministry on earth, He wasn't working on the giving part of God, He was always working on the receiving part of man. Jesus' healing ministry was fuelled by God's Word, the Holy Spirit and the Anointing. Acts 10 v 38: "how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with Power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him".

Healing always came when Jesus proclaimed the Word of God and laid hands on the sick. Jesus had faith in God's power and the Holy Spirit of God upon Him. When you minister and pray for the sick, your faith should be in the power of God not for a healing. As you lay your hands on the sick, believe for the power of God to manifest the purchased healing. When your faith is in the right place, the anointing and healing always flows.

If you have laid hands on someone who didn't receive their healing, don't stop praying for others, don't withdraw your faith and cut off God's flow of power. If healing isn't experienced, it could have something to do with misplaced faith. It is never God who is holding healing back, healing is a done deal. Stand strong in faith, knowing His anointing flows unhindered and is producing a full recovery.

Week 38 Mighty Hand of God

"...coming out of His hand..there was the hiding of His power". (Habakkuk 3 v 4)

God has so much to say about His arms, hands and even fingers. The prophet Isaiah said "the Lord has made bare His holy arm in the eyes of all the nations" Isaiah 52 v 10. In other words, when nations come against you, God rolls up His sleeves and makes bare His holy arms and says: "I will defend My people with My holy arm".

Jesus said: "But if I with the finger of God cast out devils, no doubt the kingdom of God is come upon you" Luke 11 v 20. God is so prevailing and powerful, He prevails and defends nations with His hand and with the flick of His finger He defeats the powers of satan!

Habakkuk 3 v 4 says: "..coming out of His hand..there was the hiding of His power". God's anointing is hidden in His hands. The hand of God on your life will cause you to out run all wickedness. 1 Kings 18 v 46: "the hand of the Lord was on Elijah and he girded up his loins and ran before Ahab to the entrance of Jezreel".

Expect His fresh touch, expect His fresh glorious power that is hidden in His hand to come powerfully upon you this season. Exodus 15 v 6 says: "Your right hand, O Lord has become glorious in power".

The hand of God was strong on both Saul and Jonathan, in 2 Samuel, David composed a song and it was played at their funeral, here are part of the lyrics: "...they were swifter than eagles, stronger than lions".

God's hand has not waxed short, meaning He has not ran out of power! Anything that is too big in your mind, assign it into God's hands. Assign your marriage, financial dilemma, ministry, what ever it is assign it into God's hands. God asked Moses "...Is My hand waxed short?..." (Numbers 11 v 23).

As we contend forward know that God's hand hasn't waxed short! He is still in the miracle business, He still provides every need and desire, He is still reviving and restoring.

When Moses had a fresh challenge in his life, God asked him "Doyou really think, the same God that brought you out with a high and powerful hand, has waxed short? Now that you are in the

wilderness and don't have some of the things you used to have in bondage, do you really think My hand has waxed short?".

God's hand can turn a city in one day, He can set a whole family on course spiritually and naturally. God shall protect you from all manner of disease, He shall provide your every need, His hand is not short, His anointing can reach your whole city through you!

God isn't asking you to figure it out, He is asking you to trust that He already has.

Week 39 Dominion To Dominate



"...Jesus put out His hand and touched him saying "I am willing, be cleansed". Immediately his leprosy was cleansed". (Matthew 8 v 3)

In Matthew 8, a leper came to Jesus worshipping Him saying "Lord if You are willing, You can make me clean". Notice Jesus' response "...Jesus put out His hand and touched him saying "I am willing, be cleansed". Immediately his leprosy was cleansed" Matthew 8 v 3.

Jesus didn't warn His disciples: "...boys keep your distance! If you don't you are going to catch something from this approaching leper...". No! Jesus walked in dominion, reached out to touch the leper and settled the question whether God was willing to heal, by announcing "Iam willing, be cleansed".

F.F Bosworth said: "Faith begins where the will of God is known! It is impossible to boldly claim by faith a blessing you are not sure God is offering". In other words, faith must have an element of boldness. Quit being wishy washy, wavering here and there saying things like "well maybe it is God's will... I guess I will see if it is...".

In Mark 8, Jesus came to a place call 'Bethsaida' which mean 'unrepentant town'. The Bible says, they brought a blind man to Him, who begged Him to touch him. Interestingly Jesus felt the need to take him out of the unrepentant town, before healing him.

Mark 8 v 23: "So He took the blind man by the hand and led him out of the town (Bethsaida). And when He had spit on his eyes and put His hands on him, He asked him if he saw anything". Verse 24: "And he looked up and said, "I see men trees, walking." verse 25: "Then He put His hands on his eyes again and made him look up. And he was restored and saw everyone clearly".

What was Jesus doing? He was taking him out of the wrong atmosphere before laying hands on him and healing the man.

God never intended for you just to be made well, He gave you dominion to dominate. As the disciples walked with Jesus they enjoyed His Divine health and on purpose they laid hands on lepers, they handled sickness and disease and drove it out of bodies. As you walk with Him and as your life is aligned to His Word, you too will enjoy His divine health and rule over sickness and disease as He has intended you to.

Far too many are afraid they will catch some kind of sickness from some body else when praying for them. With Christ the Healer living on the inside of you, why doubt the power of God coming out of your hands to heal the sick! People believe more in catching sickness from others, then others catching your health and spirit of victory through contact.

Fear is a spirit, and it will try its best to get on you, but so is faith. The Bible declares we have the 'spirit of faith' (2 Corinthians $4 \ v13$) and the faith we have is contagious.

Philemon v 6 says: "That the sharing of your faith may become effective by the acknowledgement of every good thing which is in you in Christ Jesus".

I pray that everyone that meets you will catch your faith and learn from you how wonderful it is to live in Christ.

Your surroundings should not effect you, you effect your surroundings. I declare sickness and disease will never be able to make you it's slave. Sickness can not overwhelm Christ within you!

Resurrection of The Dead

Luke 20 v 36: "....the children of God, being the children of the resurrection".

Acts 14 v 19 - 20: "Then Jews from Antioch and Iconium came there; and having persuaded the multitudes, they stoned Paul and dragged him out of the city, supposing him to be dead. However, when the disciples gathered around him, he rose up and went into the city. And the next day he departed with Barnabas to Derbe".

Week 40 Resurrection Time

"Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live". (John 11 v 25)

The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirits that we are God's children (Romans 8 v 16), Luke put it this way: "...they are children of God and children of the resurrection" Luke 20 v 36.

The last and final great awakening will be characterised by all generations being involved, we are talking about a transgenerational move of God just like Joel prophesied "it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions". Joel 2 v 28.

All ages shall be involved, from the oldest to the youngest and everyone in-between.

In 2 Kings 13 v 21, some Israelites were burying a man, when suddenly they saw a band of raiders. Startled and afraid, they panicked and threw the dead body into Elisha's tomb. When the body touched Elisha's bones, the man came to life and stood up on his feet.

When the new generation touched the bones of the older generation (Elisha), suddenly miracle resurrection power came to the new generation. The man stood up and was revived! Honour for the older generation from the younger generation, and honour for the younger generation from the older generation will unlock resurrection power.

Jesus declared "IAM the resurrection and the life" (John 11 v 25). Three times Jesus invaded the dark domain of death and robbed the grave of its prey.

The first time Jesus raised someone from the dead, was in Matthew 9 v 18 - 26 when He raised the ruler of the synagogue's daughter who had just died. In this account it was such a fresh death, her family had just gathered around her weeping.

The second time, Jesus raised the widow of Nain's son who had been dead long enough to be put in grave clothes. He had been placed in a coffin and was on the shoulders of the pall-bearers on the way to the tomb.

The third time, Jesus raised His friend Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus had been dead for a long time, long enough you could smell the decay of his body.

It does not matter if your issue just happened, or whether it happened a while ago and you are finally ready to bury the dream. Nor does it matter if your issue happened so long ago you have given up all hope for change, because the dream is well and truly buried.

It is never too late with God. Whether out of the tomb, on the way to the tomb or in the tomb, the degree of death of your situation with God does not matter, He is the Resurrection and the life!

Week 41 Get Out, Then Get Up



"Jesus Then He took the child by the hand, and said to her, "Talitha, cumi," which is translated, "Little girl, I say to you, arise". Immediately the girl arose and walked, for she was twelve years of age. And they were overcome with great amazement". (Mark 5 v 41 - 42)

The atmosphere within which God is able to function is faith and honour. Both of which were lacking in Jesus' own town. Mark 6 v 5 tells us Jesus in His own town "...could not do any miracles there", because of a lack of honour and faith.

Jesus the Son of God who can do anything, couldn't do anything except lay His hands on a few sick people and heal them! If you think God will do a work in your life solely because He is Almighty, you are wrong. God will work in

your life because you make room for Him and foster an atmosphere of faith.

In Mark 5 v 36 - 42, Jesus came to a home where a girl had died. The room was heavy with grief, filled with disheartened family members, wailing loudly.

The first thing Jesus did was arrest the spirit of fear and told those who were entertaining fear to leave. Mark 5 v 36: "As soon as Jesus heard the word that was spoke, He said to the ruler of the synagogue "Do not be afraid; only believe".

Jesus also questioned their actions "why make this commotion and weep? The child is not dead, but sleeping" Mark 5 v 39. The people ridiculed Jesus, so the Bible says He put them all outside. Jesus was very selective who He allowed in the room with Him. He allowed the father and mother of the child and only three of His twelve disciples; Peter, James and John (Mark 5 v 37 - 40).

What was Jesus doing? He was ensuring the correct environment was set up in order to raise up the girl from the dead. Jesus ensured there was an atmosphere of faith, positivity, an atmosphere of victory conducive for miracles in the room.

Mark 5 v 41 - 42: "He took the child by the hand, and said to her, "Talitha, cumi," which is translated, "Little girl, I say to you, arise. Immediately the girl arose and walked, for she was twelve years of age. And they were overcome with great amazement".

NLT: "Jesus holding her hand said "Little girl, get up". Before she got up, there were some people that had to get out! Jesus ensured the correct atmosphere of faith was present so that He could release resurrection power through His mouth and into the girl.

Perhaps you have been telling some things in your life to get up. Perhaps in this season of life you need to check your environment, and start telling somethings to get out. The same people that saw you in your lame season will see you in your leaping season. The same ones that saw you depressed will see you full of joy! The same ones that saw you struggling to find your lane will see you fulfilled, finishing your race.

Week 42 Surrounded

"However, when the disciples gathered around him, he rose up and went into the city". (Acts 14 v 20)

In Acts 14 v 19, Paul was stoned and dragged out of the city supposing he was dead, notice verse 20: "However, when the disciples gathered around him, he rose up and went into the city. And the next day he departed with Barnabas to Derbe".

There is strength and resurrection power released when you realise you are surrounded. Paul was surrounded by the disciples and he arose and went to the next city he was called to go. I declare you too shall rise and enter into the places God has called you to to go. Realise you are surrounded by your spiritual family in heaven, and spiritual family on earth.

Hebrew 12 v 1 "...since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us".

In this passage Paul was describing an amphi-theatre, a place filled with spectators witnessing the gladiators fight. We too are in a fight, the 'good fight of faith' and are to be in no way intimidated by the devil's antics! Paul is telling us, we are surrounded!

We are surrounded by such a great crowd of faith champions who ran their race and now are in the grand stands of heaven cheering us on as we run ours. God has filled the stands with winners, watching you while you overcome the opponents of life.

How can you quit since you are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses. We have all seen the influence a crowd can make at a football match, or the spectators lining the streets cheering on the runners during a marathon race. Many runners have testified, they would have slowed down, become weary and quit if it hadn't of been for the crowd cheering them on. They kept at it and finished the race set before them.

Hebrews 12 v 2: "looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" Verse 3: "For consider Him who endured such hostility

from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls".

Sometimes you win because of who is watching. Lifting weights at the gym with a friend is totaling different to lifting weights alone. If you want to skip a routine or shorten a set, you can't because your friend is keeping you accountable to your targets. Interestingly, when working out with others, you realise you can lift a lot more weight than you thought you could lift alone.

REFLECTION

Romans 8 v 1: "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit".

Week 43 Build With Gold, Silver + Precious Stones

COCCESSO)

"If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire". (1 Corinthians 3 v 15)

The Apostle Paul was telling the believers in Corinth (whose foundation was Jesus), to be watchful what material they use to build on the foundation (Jesus). We can build with gold, silver and precious stones, or wood, hay and straw.

Paul is laying out the categories of materials: a. Unseen spiritual methods (gold, silver, precious stones) or b. Seen natural materials and methods (wood, hay, straw).

1 Corinthians 3 v 12: "Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw", v13: "each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is". V14: "If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward". V15: "If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire". You can build on Jesus with Jesus, or you can build on Jesus without Jesus. Building without Jesus would be to build with wood, hay and straw.

Lets make some simple observations; 'gold, silver and precious stones' are always found under-ground, whereas 'wood, hay and straw' are found on the ground, not in the ground.

To harvest 'wood, hay and straw' there isn't much sacrifice needed. One category you have to dig to get it, the other category no digging is required. Not only is 'gold, silver and precious stones' found under ground, but they come in smaller sizes and quantities. Whereas 'wood, hay and straw' usually come in big quantities.

An other observation is; 'gold, silver and precious stones' are very expensive, 'wood, hay and straw' are much cheaper. 'Gold, silver and precious stones' are very rare, 'wood, hay and straw' are very common! 'Gold, silver and precious stones' don't get burnt with fire, they get purified by fire. However 'wood, hay and straw' fear fire because in the fire they are destroyed. 'Gold, silver and precious stones' get

excited by fire because they come out the other side purer, better and more expensive!

Paul was saying, don't use 'wood, hay and straw' to build your life and ministry! Don't do ministry and life to be seen by people, a lot of activity but no eternal productivity, no lasting eternal significance. God doesn't want you to live busy lives, He wants you to be fruitful, He wants you to stay productive. God wants you to live in such a way that your actions go to the next generation and impacts the world even after you are gone.

At the judgement seat of Christ, Jesus will put His fire on your life to examine and judge your whole life and everything you have done. Everything will go through the fire and anything you built on Him without Him will get turned to ash. His fire will separate between those that built on Him with Him and those who built without Him.

God's fire will separate between the faithful and the failures.

Week 44 Eternal Kingdom + Treasury



"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal".

(Matthew 6 v 19)

You must realise there are two kingdoms that you are dealing with, 'the kingdom of God' and the 'natural kingdom'. The kingdom of God is eternal, whereas the natural kingdom is temporal.

Matthew 6 v 19: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal" v20: "but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal". v21: "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also".

Since there are two kingdoms, there are also two treasuries. When you deposit into your natural kingdom it will eventually fade away, but when you deposit into the kingdom of God it will never fade away. Luke 18 v 22: "....when Jesus heard these things, He said to him, "You still lack one thing. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me.".

God's kingdom is eternal and He wants you prepared and ready for eternity. If all your treasure is in the natural kingdom, you will be pretty devastated when it is all shaken. Hebrew 12 v 27: "Now this, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of those things that are being shaken, as of things that are made, that the things which cannot be shaken may remain".

Have you ever lost earthly treasure at some point? Perhaps a bad business deal? An investment? Something that faded away and came to nothing? Don't tolerate loss, expect restoration and increase. Don't waste time overthinking any loss, it really isn't that important, after all everything will all be lost anyway.

God has planned and made provisions ahead of time for your every need and desire! But nothing in this natural temporal realm will remain. The only thing that will remain is what is done and accomplished for the kingdom of God.

Which kingdom are you living in? Which kingdom are you spending most of your time, talent and treasure? You have to make a choice which kingdom you are depositing in.

I am not saying you can't have treasures down here on earth, but what I am saying is; don't make that the major part of your portfolio. One hundred years from now, where you lived, what you wore, where you went on holiday, what car you drove, all of that will not mean a thing.

Luke 12 v 21 (AMP): "So it is for the one who continues to store up and hoard possessions for himself, and is not rich [in his relationship] toward God.". Make winning souls your number one purpose in life.

*Week 45*The Heavenly Prize Awaits



"I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead". (Philippians 3 v 13)

You don't have to wait for what is next to be content, satisfied and joy filled! Enjoy the season you are in right now, and at the same time know there is so much ahead also.

Paul in the same breath talked about being content, forgetting the past and pressing forward to the future. (Philippians 3 v 13).

Have you apprehended all that you have been apprehended for? Paul understood he was apprehended by God, but there were things and people he needed to apprehend for God. Here is how: "....forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward....".

Paul continued by saying, "I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3 v 14). There is a high calling for you in Christ, and when you fulfil it, there is a heavenly prize waiting for you. You don't get the prize for the race until you have ran it! God is our Rewarder in this life and the next.

People spend so much on natural things that will fade away, instead of pressing forward for the upward heavenly call. Martin Luther said, "I have held many things in my hand and I have lost them all, but whatever I place in God's hand, that I still possess".

Matthew 6 v 19: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal", Mothballs are terrible, some people's investments smell like their great grandmother's unopened suitcase, found in the loft after several decades!

John Wesley said, "I value all things only by the price they should gain in eternity". In other words, what price does our material things gain in eternity? Nothing is the answer. So don't be so concerned with what you have or do not have.

Look back no more, it is a new day, press forward for the things that you are supposed to bring in to God's kingdom, and you will not be disappointed, your heavenly prize awaits.

GREAT COMMANDMENTS

Cocossos.

Matthew 22 v 37 - 40: "Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets".

- 1. Love God
- 2. Love People

Love God

Mark 1 v 41: "Then Jesus, moved with compassion, stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I am willing; be cleansed".

2 Corinthians 8 v 24: "Therefore show to them, and before the churches, the proof of your love and of our boasting on your behalf".

John 4 v 23: "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him".

Week 46 God's Compassion

"Then Jesus, moved with compassion, stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I am willing; be cleansed". $(Mark\ 1\ v\ 41)$

We magnify the power of God and we should, but not more than we magnify God's compassion. We need to magnify God's willingness to use His power more than the power itself. There is no place in the Bible that tells us 'God is power', but the Word does confirm 'God is Love'.

Having compassion qualifies you as an instrument for healing. What touches your heart? What grieves you? Nehemiah wept and prayed before God because of the state of the walls. Nehemiah 1 v 4: "...sat down and wept, and mourned for many days, I was fasting and praying before the God

of heaven". Nehemiah wasn't a professional wall builder, but he found his assignment by what touched his heart.

In Mark 1 v 41, we see Jesus was "moved with compassion, He stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I am willing; be cleansed." v42: "As soon as He had spoken, immediately the leprosy left him, and he was cleansed".

Not only has God got the nature and ability to heal and restore lives, He also has the desire and compassion to do so. In Matthew 14 v 14 Jesus saw the multitude and He was moved with compassion to bring restoration. God heals and restores people because He loves people. There was a lot of people Jesus healed who never served Him, never did anything for Him, but we never see Jesus taking back what He gave them. God loves humanity and He is willing to heal all.

Jesus ministered with compassion, He was moved by those afflicted! In Matthew 9 v 36, we see once again, Jesus saw the people and felt for them and began to heal them all. Jesus was constantly moved by compassion (the two blind men in Matthew $20\,\mathrm{v}$ 34, and the leper in Mark $1\,\mathrm{v}$ 41).

F.F. Bosw orth said: "It is not faith in God's power that secures His blessings, but faith in His love and in His will..... Satan is willing that we shall magnify the Lord's power, because he knows that this is not a sufficient basis for faith, but that the Lord's compassion and willingness are...".

Luke 7 v 13: "When the Lord saw her (the widow), He had compassion on her and said to her, "Do not weep.". Then He raised her son from the dead and stopped the funeral because Jesus had compassion for the women.

We hear it all the time 'God is able', but really how much faith does it take to say that? Demons know God is able, the devil also knows God is willing, but he has tried to keep people from really knowing how willing God is and how passionate He is to save, heal and restore.

Never forget it! Psalm 103 v 2 - 4: "forget not all His benefits. Who forgives all your iniquities, Who heals all your diseases. Who redeems your life from destruction...".

Week 47 Love Proven

"Therefore show to them, and before the churches, the proof of your love and of our boasting on your behalf".

(2 Corinthians 8 v 24)

Paul told the Corinthians, they would be given a chance to prove and demonstrate that their love is genuine, through their generous giving. Through your offering to God you prove and demonstrate your love and faith in Him to provide your every need and desire, is genuine.

Dr Billy Graham was the one that said, "If you show me someone's cheque book, I can show you what they worship". It is easy to spend money on who or what you love.

Many people confess they love and honour God, but if they struggle to surrender just part of their material goods and possessions, I question the sincerity of their confession. How can you say you love God, Who you can not see, and are not generous to those you do see.

1 John 4 v 20: "If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?".

Show God you truly love Him, by loving others. Show God you truly have put your faith in Him concerning your finances, by your generosity to His house and God will do exceedingly abundantly above all you can imagine (Ephesians 3 v 20).

In Deuteronomy 26 v 8 - 9, God told the Israelites exactly what to say when they brought their tithes. He instructed them to acknowledge the fact that He had brought them out of the bondage of Egypt and to say, "The Lord brought us forth out of Egypt with a mighty hand and with an outstretched arm, and with great terribleness and with signs, and with wonders, and He has brought us into this place, and has given us this land, even a land that flows with milk and honey".

Bring the tithe and give your offering with joy, for He has been faithful to bring you to the land of mercy, to the land of joy, to a land of peace and prosperity. Give with joy, tithe in faith and celebrate the finished work of Christ.

Look to God as your sole source of supply. If God won't do it, let it remain undone. If God won't make it happen, it can stay not happening.

Week 48 Praise + Worship Sets The Atmosphere

"But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him". (John 4 v 23)

Worship sets the atmosphere so that God's anointing can come into manifestation. Don't wait for God to send His anointing, God is waiting for you to set an atmosphere of praise in your home, ministry and businesses for His anointing to flow in.

If we foster an atmosphere of praise in our homes, ministries and businesses, satan can not survive in that atmosphere. Heart felt praisers, is the last thing the devil wants to see. Psalm 145 v 10 - 12: "All Your works shall praise You, O Lord, And Your saints shall bless You". Verse 11: "They shall speak of the glory of Your kingdom, And talk of Your power," verse 12: "To make known to the sons of men His mighty acts, And the glorious majesty of His kingdom".

God spoke to Norvel Hayes saying: "Your teaching faith and confession, your praying for the sick, but you need to worship Me more and teach My people to worship Me more".

Faith confessions and praying for the sick are not substitutes for worshipping God's glorious majesty. People need to be taught to worship God more, otherwise they will have the tendency to worry more and rejoice less.

Jesus said: "the Father is seeking for true worshipers of Him" (John 4 v 23). People are waiting for God to send His anointing, but God is waiting for us to set an atmosphere for His anointing to flow in.

According to Psalm 22 v 3, God attends to our praises and when He does, every wall falls flat. The walls that kept you out of what God said is yours, fall flat as you worship in spirit and in truth. Through praise and worship, bring God in the midst of your ministry and family life. Psalm 22 v 3: "But You are holy, Enthroned in the praises of Israel".

David was considered lowest of all his brothers, even his own father didn't think enough about him to present him before

the prophet Samuel. But God saw him and heard him singing and serving in the field (1 Samuel 16 v 11).

God knows how to locate His true lovers and worshippers, no matter what people think! Don't just worship, be a worshiper, for God still seeks true worshippers and praisers (John 4 v 23).

Your celebration is a demonstration of satan's defeat!

REFLECTION

Matthew 7 v 3 - 5: "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye".

Love People

1 John 2 v 5 - 6: "whosoever keeps His Word, in Him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know that we are in Him. He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked".

1 John 4 v 8: "He who does not love does not know God, for God is love".

Matthew 5 v 43 - 44: "You have heard that it was said "You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies, bless these who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you".

Ephesians 3 v 18 - 19: "....may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height".

Week 49 Love Defined

"...whosœver keeps His Word, in Him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know that we are in Him. He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked". (1 John 2 v 5 - 6)

The true definition of 'love' has been lost, because of the way society uses the word. You hear people say: "I love ice-cream", "I love that film", "I love cake, I love it", "I love that paint colour", "I love my house...". We have people loving their cars, loving their shoes, people love their scented candles. The word 'love' has been over used, resulting in the true definition of love being lost.

This would explain why most people do not understand what love is. The most googled thing on the internet 'what is love?'.

If you type the word 'love' in google books, all sorts of titles come up, which have nothing to do with love at all. People are confused as to what love really is, but they are searching for it.

The Bible defines what is love in 1 John 4 v 8: "He who does not love does not know God...", here is why "...for God is Love".

In 1 Corinthians 13, Paul the Apostle writes to a community of believers in Corinth. This place was like Amsterdam, Holly Wood and Las Vegas, but perhaps even crazier. Yet in the midst of a very confused city full of people searching for love, there is a committed community of Spirit filled believers.

Paul writes in an urgent manner to these believers, clearly defining what love really is. He explains love isn't a feeling, it isn't a bed of roses and scented candles. Love is real, Love has been demonstrated by the life, death, burial and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Don't be someone who just enjoys hearing about what 'Love' is, you can live it out, talk is out and walk it out! In fact, every spiritual force derives it's action from love, for example:

- Faith works by love (Galatians 5 v 6)
- Answered prayer is not possible when a believer steps outside of love (1 Peter 3 v 7)
- Mountain moving faith will be hindered if you don't operate in love (Mark 11 v 25)
- The gifts of the Spirit operating through you, will be hindered if you don't operate in love (1 Corinthians 13 v 2).

1 Corinthians 13 v 4: "Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud" v5: "or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged". Instead of getting so emotional about what 'they' said about you, die to yourself and keep no record of their wrong! Die to your old nature, Ephesians 4 v 22: "throw off your old sinful nature and your former way of life....", die to your old self.

Here is how you know you are dead to self, when 'they' throw dirt on you and you don't feel it anymore, after all your dead. However, if people are throwing dirt on you and you are getting up-set, angry, irritable and you want to quit and leave.... then you know you haven't died to self yet.

1 Corinthians 13 v 7: says "...love bears all things...(at all times)". In the original Greek, the word used to describe the word 'bears' is translated 'roof'.

Paul was telling those in Corinth, "you are to be a roof for each other. Which is to say, you need to cover one another, for love covers a multitude of sins".

Perhaps you have a roof with a lot of open skylights, but you are supposed to cover not expose. To cover doesn't mean; ignore the sin. It means we do not use people's weaknesses, failings, sins to expose, humiliate or shame them. You need to have people in your life who have solid roofs and you yourself need to be a solid roof for your friends and family placed around you.

There isn't anything that is more important to learn about, then love. Let the Spirit of God through your time spent with Him; perfect the love within you. How accurately you perfect your love walk with God and people, will determine how much of God's perfect plan you get to accomplish.

Remember you are one with Jesus (1 Corinthians 6 v 17), and He has poured His love in your heart by the Holy Ghost (Romans 5 v 5), therefore do not despair you can love people through Love Himself. Never forget it, you are not a body, you are a spirit with a love nature. The Holy Spirit will continue to help you and teach you to live out the 'love life' and as a result your 'faith life' will be ever increasing.

Paul then takes it further, by urging the Corinthians to: "Go after a life of love as if your life depended on it, because it does…" 1 Corinthians 14 v 1 (MSG).

Week 50 God Kind Of Love + Faith

Cockson.

"...may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height". (Ephesians 3 v 18 - 19)

It isn't possible to comprehend the love of God when we think in natural terms. What kind of love lasts forever, goes wherever, reaches the deepest pit and overlooks all mistakes? It is the God kind. 1 John 3 v 1: "..Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God!...". It is the God kind of love that will never quit on you, it lasts and lasts and lasts!

Ephesians 3 v 18 - 19: "may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height" v19: "to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; that you may be

filled with all the fullness of God". Paul was saying, the love of God that Jesus came to express is wide, long, deep and high.

How long is God's Love? Well, it lasts forever. Natural human love wears out, it is called divorce, it is called busted families, but God's love lasts forever. Do you want to know how long God will love you? Forever, that is how long.

How wide is God's Love? It is so wide you can't go anywhere where His love can not reach you. His love is so long that it lasts forever, but it is so wide it can find you no matter how far away you feel like you are from God.


How deep is God's Love? So deep, if you are in the deepest pit you have ever been in, His love goes all the way down. God doesn't just spend time with people who are on top of the world, God's love is deep, His love comes to you no matter where you may be.

How high is God's Love? So high He can overlook all the bad choices you've made in life! All of your past mistakes and decisions, God overlooks the moment you repent.

God's love will come looking for you no matter how far away or how deep in sin you may have got. Psalm 139 v 7 - 8: "Where shall I go from your Spirit? Or where shall I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there! If I make my bed in Sheol, you are there!".

If you feel helpless, wretched, or sick, look to the God of all grace and mercy. Lay hold of God's faithfulness! Faith and love are kin, Jesus said: "have the God kind of faith" (Mark 11 v 22), one translation says "lay hold of God's faithfulness". In other words, your faith is simply a reaction of your understanding of God's faithfulness. If you are struggling in faith, focus on His faithfulness and your faith will rise.

Week 51 Sacrificial Love



"...You have heard that it was said "You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies, bless these who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you".

(Mothbour 5 x 42, 44)

(Matthew 5 v 43 - 44)

The Bible doesn't say 'God has love', it says 'God is Love'. Love and God are one.

If you are missing Love from your life, it is impossible to say you are walking with God.

If you are not sensitive to Love, then it is impossible to say you are sensitive to God, for God is Love (1 John 4 v 8).

Love is your place of strength and joy, it is your place of fullness and richness. That is why the enemy is going to do everything in his power to move you out of love. If there is one thing you have got to be sensitive to, it is to always make sure you are walking in paths of love.

The devil uses 'enemies' to get you out of love, and consequently out of your place of strength, joy and fullness. But there is a blessing and a great reward that comes from loving an enemy that you can't get any other way.

Matthew 5 v 43 - 44 says: "You have heard that it was said "You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies, bless these who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you".

When ever you see Jesus saying something, you have only got one choice, if you are a Christian and that is to submit to it. Jesus instructed us to actively love those who are actively or passively hostile toward us.

Some are actively trying to show you they do not like you, then there are those who are a lot more passive about it. They look niæ, sound niæ, but on the inside their heart is warring against you.

Jesus told us to love our enemies, not tolerate them, but love them. It isn't just sitting back and not letting them provoke you to a negative action. Bible 'Love' is not love unless there is sacrifice and sacrifice means you lay down something, you give something. Jesus wants you and I to go out of our way to be good to people who are bad to us.

There are three things that remain, faith, hope, and love, yet love surpasses them all! (1 Corinthians 13 v 13)

Week 52 Live The Dream + Forsake All Pain

"...may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height". (Ephesians 3 v 18 - 19)

In this season, I believe God will revive hearts to believe and dream again. Genesis 41 v 51: "Joseph called the name of the firstborn Manasseh: "For God has made me forget all my toil and all my father's house." v52: "And the name of the second he called Ephraim: "For God has caused me to be fruitful in the land of my affliction.".

Before you give birth to your God given dream, you need to give birth to two sons 'Manasseh' which means; 'God has

made me forget the pain of my father's house' and 'Ephraim', which means; 'I am fruitful in the land of affliction'.

In order to see the dream fulfilled, the first thing you need to do is forgive and forget what other people have done. You need to release forgiveness to your own brothers and sisters, fathers and mothers. Then you will see fruitfulness in the land of afflictions.

Forgiveness releases mercy and grace, but it also releases increase and fruitfulness. True love of God working in and through you will release people who have done you wrong.

Forgiveness isn't keeping score but losing count. Ephesians 4 v 31 says put away from you: "...all bitterness, wrath, anger, evil speaking be put away from you with all malice". Verse 32: "Instead be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you".

Put away all un-forgiveness and demonstrate love by your giving and forgiving those who have hurt you. What a lot of people call love is "...you are wonderful today and I can not stand you tomorrow", that is fickle and changing.

There are no benefits associated with un-forgiveness, so forsake it and embrace God's love for you and love others with His love and there will be untold blessings manifest.

Psalm 126 v 1: "A Song of Ascents. When the LORD brought back the captivity of Zion, We were like those who dream" verse 2: "Then our mouth was filled with laughter, And our tongue with singing. Then they said among the nations, "The LORD has done great things for them.".

REFLECTION

Philippians 4 v 6 - 7: "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus".


